Music Notes

Charles Tournemire (1870-1939) was a late Romantic French organist and composer. He is known especially for his improvisations based on themes derived from Gregorian Chant. He was a student of Cesar Franck and eventually ascended to Franck's previously held organist position at the Basilica of St. Clotilde, Paris. We are fortunate that this improvisational genius arrived in the midst of sound recording technology. Recordings of many of him improvising at the organ actually exist! One such recording can be heard using the following link.

This particular improvisation is based on the Chant, "Victimae Paschali Lauds," translated as "Praise the Paschal Victim," a chant meant to be sung on Easter Sunday. This improvisation really captures Tournemire's skill as an improvisor. His student, Maurice Durufle, transcribed several of his improvisations for performance by other organists. While in our worship services, I tend to be fairly scripted, playing works written by others in the prelude, offertory and postlude spots, at communion I tend to improvise during the distribution of the elements. There is a similarity between composer and performer merging in improvisation and church and Savior merging during communion, somehow expressing sonically the holy mystery of the sacrament. I hope you enjoy the recording.
