In the next month the worship topics will focus on prayer. The topics will be:

- January 24: The Prayer of a Wise Leader: Kings David and Solomon 1 Kings 3:7-15
- February 7: The Prayer of the Bold: Peter and John. Acts 4:24-31
- February 14: The Prayer for Christ to Be in Us: Paul Ephesians 3:14-21

I ask that you practice the "Three Squared" prayer daily. Pray three times a day, for three minutes, for three things:

- 1) Thank God for something.
- 2) **Realign** with God (lifting up where you've sinned or fallen short-and ask for forgiveness.
- 3) Pray to **share God's love/kindness** with someone.

We are living in a time when we need to center ourselves in God's Presence and pray for our nation. Giving thanks centers our minds on God's goodness. Realigning reconnects us with God. Praying to share God's love/kindness provides intentionality of living God's love and making a difference. Let's pray for God to do things beyond what we can do, and to be the presence of God's goodness.

2020 Financial Summary

2020 was a challenging year for the operation and finances of our Church. We are also sure that 2020 was challenging for our members. Even with these challenges, thanks to your generous giving, \$352,986 was received for operational and loan expenses. This income plus \$34,000 from a Paycheck Protection Program Loan, to cover part of our payroll costs and \$30,514 for the HVAC system, brought our total income to \$417,500. Our total expenses for the year were \$378,051 (included in this amount were the cost of the HVAC system \$31,100 and salary costs of \$151,894). Thanks to the dedicated efforts of our staff in keeping expenses down, we are ending the year with a surplus, after adjustments, of \$39,185. While it is nice to finish with a surplus, there was 6 months when income received did not cover expenses. We are also hoping that with the submission of the proper documentation that the \$34,000 loan will be forgiven.

Following is a summary of our 2020 financial accomplishments.

- \$331,619 was received against the pledge categories of Budget, Missions and Mortgage (\$108,275 over stewardship pledges).
- Incremental Giving
 - \$3,434 was received for "in-kind" donations (purchases of non-budgeted items by members).
 - \$490 was received in Holiday Offerings (Easter and Christmas).
 - \$17,443 was received to cover operating expenses. (i.e. loose income, rentals, altar/holiday flowers, book study, office supplies, worship transmission upgrades, etc.)
 - \$30,514 was received from members to cover a new Church HVAC system.
 - \$20,793 was received for non-budget items (i.e. hunger, memorials, UMCOR, Christ Net, Heifer program, scholarships, youth activities and work camps).
- Income from Other Sources
 - \$34,000 PPP Loan was received from the U.S. Government Cares Act.
- Distributions
 - \$42,090 was paid toward budgeted distributions for apportionments/askings to the Conference, District
 and Methodist Union. This will be the 32nd consecutive year that our Church has paid 100% of the
 requested conference apportionments.
 - \$8,246 was paid in incremental payments to reduce our loan principal.
 - \$1,700 was given to various United Methodist charities (UMCOR)
 - \$2,127 was given to non-conference charities (local hunger programs and Christ Net).
 - \$1,000 was given to fill Mother's Day Boxes local hunger (in-kind).
 - Gift cards amounting to about \$1300 were given to the Trenton police for distribution (\$785 in-kind plus cards dropped off at the Church).
 - \$3,000 was spent on providing educational scholarships for members.
 - The donations above do not include distributions that did not pass through the general Church accounts (i.e. United Methodist Women distributions).

We should be proud of our 2020 financial accomplishments and we are hoping to return to some kind of normal services and programs sometime in 2021. The Finance Committee and Ad Council have approved an adjusted 2021 budget of \$355,541 to reflect the current times. Later in 2021 both groups will review the budget to reflect any changes in projected income and Church operations and program.
