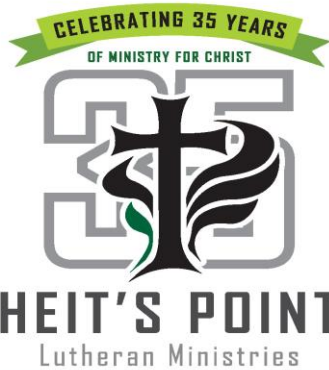

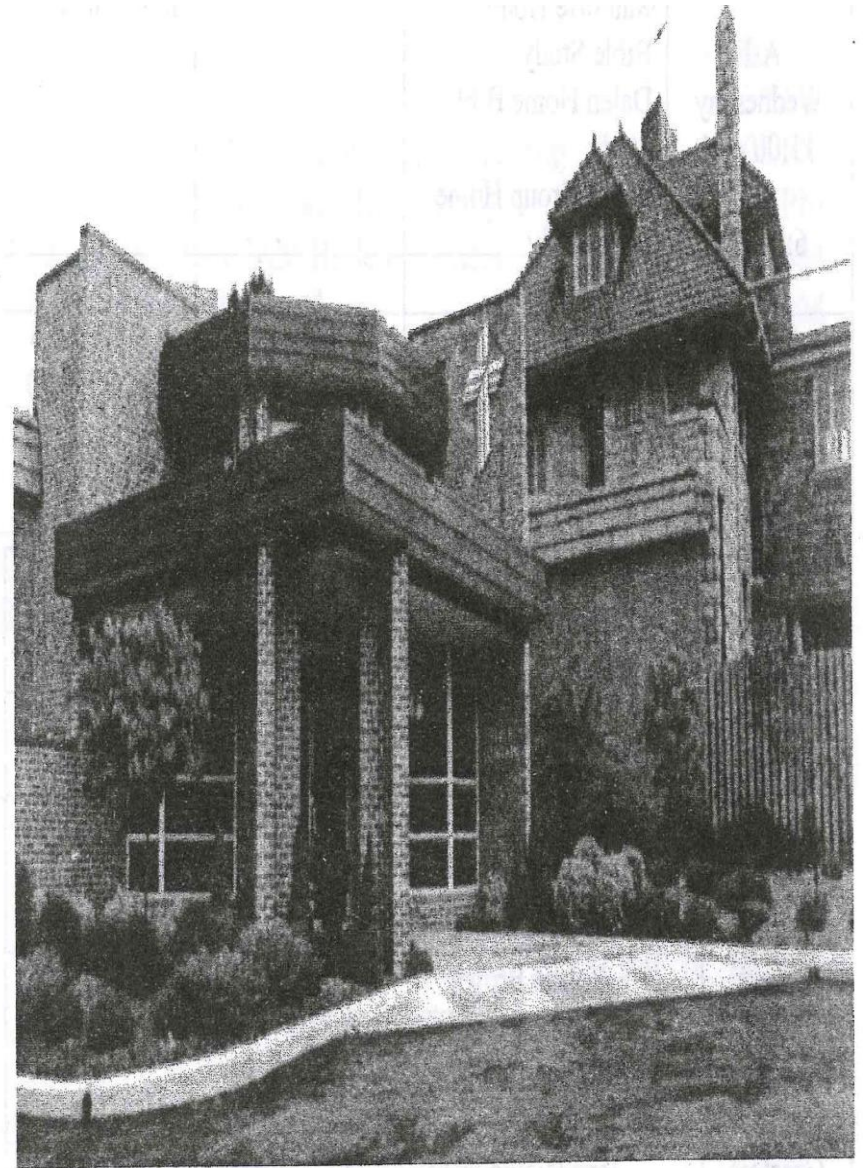

Our story this week is about Paul and Silas in jail, this lesson highlights the events and faith of the early Church. Paul and Silas zealous to share the Gospel of Jesus with the Philippians. Yet, their message caused fear and anger among leaders. Paul and Silas were thrown into a Philippian prison. Confined to the stocks, they sang songs of praise to Jesus and prayed. God caused an earthquake to occur, freeing all the prisoners, and the jailer, who was responsible for all of them, almost took his own life. However, Paul and Silas reassured the jailer they were not going to escape. That night, hearing the message of salvation, the jailer and the members of his household became believers in Jesus. The Holy Spirit keeps us faithful and believing even in time of trouble.
