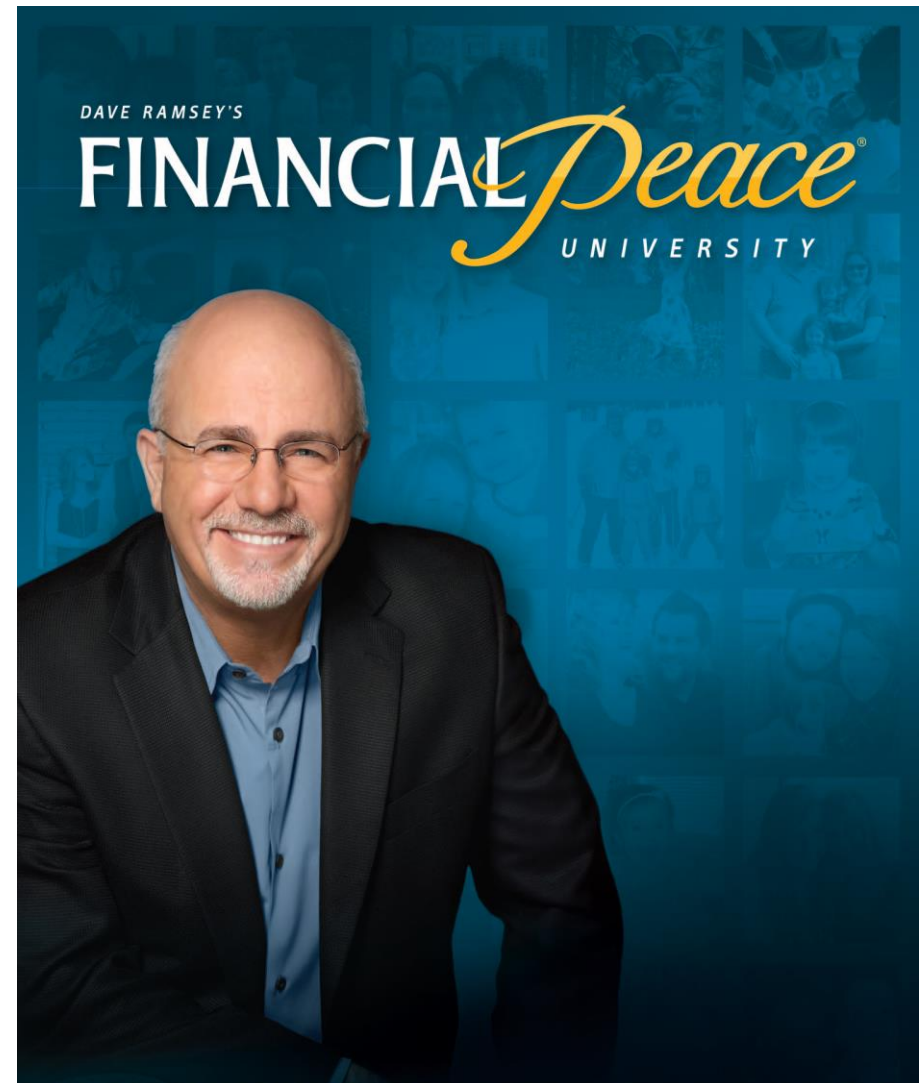


Peace's Mission Sunday, September 20th
