From the Pastor

Easter Life, Faith & the Resurrection

As certain as the Sunday morning when the tomb was empty, there will be a day when God dwells with His people in a place without even the faintest hint of sin. Thank goodness we will rest in Him forever. But until then, those with resurrection life can persevere in giving, celebrating, and serving because we know we are part of a greater story. We continue, even when there does not seem to be momentum or fruit, because we have joined the resurrection now. We remember that Jesus has been raised as a preview of the life to come. This is the gift of the worldrenewing resurrection!

When we are standing on the other side of the river, we know that resurrection life is worth believing in. We sense power in the mundane... ... a creative, life-changing power that resonates the closer we get to others. It motivates us to serve others for the flourishing of humanity, but at the center is a Person. We are now drawn into a relationship with the most powerful, beautiful, creative Person in the universe.....the risen Christ. The beloved disciple describes Him: "And in the midst of the lampstands I saw one like a son of man, clothed with a long robe and with a golden sash around His chest. The hairs of His head were white like wool, as white as snow. His eyes were like a flame of fire, His feet were like burnished bronze, refined in a furnace, and His voice was like the roar of many waters. In His right hand He held seven stars, from His mouth came a sharp two-edged sword, and His face was like the sun shining in full strength." (Rev. 1:13-16)

The resurrection is like a river that seems impossible to cross when we first come to the riverbank. We can see the other side and it looks good, but we are not sure how to get there. Even though we just cannot see at that point... ...the truth is that God always provides a way. Who knows, there might be a ferry, subtly hidden off to the side. When we cannot see the way or a way, what do we do, turn around and walk away? Or do we "look" for a way. Will we take the ferry of faith across the river of doubt? Will we redirect our faith to the radiant Jesus? As we do, we are transported to the other side, through no doing of our own, but right into the resurrection. Jesus carries us there, where we begin to experience the benefits of the resurrected life right away. By faithfulness we keep stepping forward and we are amazed at what we have been given... ... a new authority (a gracious King), a new identity (truly human), and a new purpose (joining God in the renewal of all things).

My friends, by faith, Jesus' death and resurrection can become our death and resurrection, releasing us to live a truly human life. Best of all, when we turn away from trusting our unreliable selves to turn to the reliable, resurrected Christ, we gain intimacy with the most beautiful, powerful, creative, and gracious Person the world will ever know.

My goodness, how much better life is with Jesus! But it is not simply better, it is the absolutely best and greatest gift we can ever receive! Jesus offers deeper joy, more profound meaning, and true purpose. There is no question that life with Jesus is truer. He is the One for whom we were made. This Easter, as we join Jesus, we join the Person who changes everything, even us. Praying you have the Happiest Easter ever Pastor David.

The Lesson of Easter from an Unlikely Child

After all, their only child had a terminal illness. But it wasn't fair to keep him in her class. She had 18 other youngsters to teach, and Jeremy was a distraction. Furthermore, he would never learn to read and write. Why waste any more time trying?

As she pondered the situation, guilt washed over her. Here I am complaining when my problems are nothing compared to that poor family, she thought. Lord, please help me to be more patient with Jeremy. From that day on, she tried hard to ignore Jeremy's noises and his blank stares. Then one day, he limped to her desk, dragging his bad leg behind him.

"I love you, Miss Miller," he exclaimed, loud enough for the whole class to hear. The other students snickered, and Doris' face turned red. She stammered, "Wh-why that's very nice, Jeremy. N-now please take your seat."

Spring came, and the children talked excitedly about the coming of Easter. Doris told them the story of Jesus, and then to emphasize the idea of new life springing forth, she gave each of the children a large plastic egg. "Now," she said to them, "I want you to take this home and bring it back tomorrow with something inside that shows new life. Do you understand?"

"Yes, Miss Miller," the children responded enthusiastically – all except for Jeremy. He listened intently; his eyes never left her face. He did not even make his usual noises. Had he understood what she had said about Jesus' death and resurrection? Did he understand the assignment? Perhaps she should call his parents and explain the project to them.

That evening, Doris' kitchen sink stopped up. She called the landlord and waited an hour for him to come by and unclog it. After that, she still had to shop for groceries, iron a blouse, and prepare a vocabulary test for the next day. She completely forgot about phoning Jeremy's parents.

The next morning, 19 children came to school, laughing and talking as they placed their eggs in the large wicker basket on Miss Miller's desk. After they completed their math lesson, it was time to open the eggs. In the first egg, Doris found a flower. "Oh yes, a flower is certainly a sign of new life," she said. "When plants peek through the ground, we know that spring is here." A small girl in the first row waved her arm. "That's my egg, Miss Miller," she called out. The next egg contained a plastic butterfly, which looked very real. Doris held it up. "We all know that a caterpillar changes and grows into a beautiful butterfly. Yes, that's new life, too." Little Judy smiled proudly and said, "Miss Miller, that one is mine." Next, Doris found a rock with moss on it. She explained that moss, too, showed life. Billy spoke up from the back of the classroom, "My daddy helped me," he beamed.

Then Doris opened the fourth egg. She gasped. The egg was empty. Surely it must be Jeremy's she thought, and of course, he did not understand her instructions. If only she had not forgotten to phone his parents. Because she did not want to embarrass him, she quietly set the egg aside and reached for another. Suddenly, Jeremy spoke up. "Miss Miller, aren't you going to talk about my egg?" Flustered, Doris replied, "But Jeremy, your egg is empty." He looked into her eyes and said softly, "Yes, but Jesus' tomb was empty, too."

Time stopped. When she could speak again, Doris asked him, "Do you know why the tomb was empty?" "Oh, yes," Jeremy said, "Jesus was killed and put in there. Then His Father raised Him up."

The recess bell rang. While the children excitedly ran out to the school yard, Doris cried. The cold inside her melted completely away.

Three months later, Jeremy <u>died</u>. Those who paid their respects at the mortuary were surprised to see 19 eggs on top of his casket, all of them empty.
