#### From the Pastor August 2014

#### "School Daze"

Well it's that time of year again. Summer is wrapping up and the kids are getting ready to go back to school in less than three weeks. Then our kids will be up early and out the door early each morning. The house will not only be guieter, it'll be much cleaner and the food will seem to last longer. Our children will be

transitioning from Summer slack-off mode to back to school mode with all its classes, sports and homework. Their brains and bodies are being challenged again after a Summer's worth of television, I-Pods, I-Phones. texting, Tweeting, Snapchatting & other communicating.

As parents, this should also be a time to challenge our heads, hearts and bodies. Many people skip church during the Summer and Bible studies and seminars seem to be far and few. 

On Sat., August 16th at 6 p.m. Grace and First Baptist Church will host a






## Needed: Children's Church **Volunteers!**
