"...for to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." (Luke 2:11).

With these words the angel announced to the shepherds the good news of the long awaited Messiah's arrival. This season is a time to reflect upon the great love our heavenly Father has for us. He saw fit to send us His only Son to be born into this world and then Jesus was sacrificed for our sins. There is no greater gift than the gift of God's only child. Jesus' birth is a true celebration of the infinite love of our heavenly Father.

The materialism that accompanies Christmas can make it challenging to keep our families focused on remembering the 'reason for the season'. It takes forethought and planning to preserve the meaning of Christmas for our families. Here are a few ideas on how to keep the spirit of Christmas alive for our families:

- 1. Decorate the Christmas tree together, but prior to putting on the star (or angel) and lighting the tree have a 'tree dedication' service. The children can be given candles to hold and a simple prayer can be shared such as, "This tree is a blessing to our home. It reminds us of all the beautiful things You have created. Let it, Lord, remind us of the Tree of Life You placed in the Garden of Eden, and of the tree that You made into the new Tree of Life, the cross of Christ." Then read Titus 3:4-8.
- 2. Have a Christmas Manger. Consider drawing and coloring the manger and its' contents with your children. Put the wise men across the room a week before Christmas and have them gradually approach the manger arriving on Christmas day. Put Mary and Joseph in the manger on Christmas Eve and put the Jesus figure in the manger on Christmas day (as opposed to having him there days or weeks before).
- 3. Before opening gifts on Christmas morning read the birth narrative (Luke chapter 2). Pairing a reading of the arrival of God's gift with the receiving of other Christmas gifts helps children remember that gift giving is done to imitate what our heavenly Father gave us on Christmas day. Pause to recognize the special gifts God has brought to your family this year, and to recognize the special gifts each person brings to the family. And be sure to thank God for giving Jesus, the greatest Gift, on the first Christmas Day.
- 4. Read the birth narrative just prior to Christmas dinner. At the moment of the announcement of Jesus' birth light a special 'Christ candle' in the center of the Christmas dinner table.
 - 5. Attend Advent and Christmas Services at church and ask if you can assist in any way.
- <u>6.</u> Give a gift to the church. Explain to your children that Christmas is Jesus birthday. When someone goes to a birthday party they bring a gift. This year bring a gift for the church in honor of Jesus' birthday.

May your Christmas be filled with the joy in the birth of our Savior. Merry Christmas! Pastor David




TITHING ENVELOPES ARE NOW AVAILABLE

Confused, but finding their joyous spirit contagious, I grinned right back at them.

"Are you Susan?" The man stepped forward as he held out a box for me.

Nodding stupidly, unable to find my voice, I was sure they thought I was mentally deficient.

"These are for you." The woman t<mark>hrust another box at me with a huge, be</mark>aming smile. The porch light and the snow falling behind her cast a glow over <mark>her dark hair, lending her an angelic appearance.</mark>

I looked down into her box. It was filled to the top with delicious treats, a fat turkey, and all the makings of a traditional Christmas dinner. My eyes filled with tears as the realization of why they were there washed over me.

Finally coming to my senses, I found my voice and invited them in. Following the husband were two children, staggering with the weight of their packages. The family introduced themselves and told me their packages were all gifts for my little family. This wonderful, beautiful family, who were total strangers to me, somehow knew exactly what we needed. They brought wrapped gifts for each of us, a full buffet for me to make on Christmas Day, and many "extras" that I could never afford. Visions of a beautiful, "normal" Christmas literally danced in my head. Somehow my secret wish for Christmas was materializing right in front of me. The desperate prayers of a single mom had been heard, and I knew right then that God had sent his angels my way.


My mysterious angels then handed me a white envelope, gave me another round of grins, and took turns hugging me. They wished me a Merry Christmas and disappeared into the night as suddenly as they had appeared.

Amazed and deeply touched, I looked around me at the boxes and gifts strewn at my feet and felt the ache of depression suddenly being transformed into a childlike joy. I began to cry. I cried hard, sobbing tears of the deepest gratitude. A great sense of peace filled me. The knowledge of God's love reaching into my tiny corner of the world enveloped me like a warm quilt. My heart was full. I fell to my knees amid all the boxes and offered a heartfelt prayer of thanks.

Getting to my feet, I wrapped myself in my blankets and sat once again to gaze out the window at the gently falling snow. Suddenly, I remembered the envelope. Like a child, I ripped it open and gasped at what I saw. A shower of bills flitted to the floor. Gathering them up, I began to count the five, ten, and twenty-dollar bills. As my vision blurred with tears, I counted the money, then recounted it to make sure I had it right. Sobbing again, I said it out loud: "One hundred dollars."

I looked at my children sleeping soundly, and through my tears I smiled my first happy, free-of-worry smile in a long, long time. My smile turned into a grin as I thought about tomorrow: Christmas Eve. One visit from complete strangers had magically turned a painful day into a special one that we would always remember...with happiness.



ZOOM Bible Study This is exciting NEWS!



All because God's love came down and filled the earth all around. So we celebrate at Christmas time our Savior and Lord, holy, divine!


We honor Jesus throughout the year so the Christmas spirit will linger near. For the story of His birth is ours to tell that Jesus became our Emmanuel!

Gift Give-Out Day:


Tues., Dec. 15 - Parent Drive-Thru Pick-up day: 8:30 am - 1:30 pm
