

From Epworth:

Dear Colleagues in Ministry,

I send greetings from the children and staff at Epworth Children's Home, and send this letter as a reminder that Mother's Day this year is Sunday, May 9th. Our Annual Conference has designated this day as a time to promote children's ministry through Epworth, and to take a special offering for God's work through Epworth. **Epworth is not an apportioned item** and it relies heavily on the offerings received on Mother's Day and Work Day to provide quality care to the 100 plus individuals who are in Epworth's care at any given moment.

I realize this request comes once again during an uncertain time for us as United Methodists and as people who are facing uncertainty in the health care arena. I am certain that your congregation, like Epworth, has seen its financial resources negatively affected by the quarantine and other measures that now exists. We are not certain that the current practices will be lifted by Mother's Day.


Grace has the honor of recognizing three college graduates:

A Mother's Occupation

Inspirational Story on the importance of a mother's role

A woman named Emily renewing her driver's license at the Transport office was asked by the clerk to state her occupation. She hesitated, uncertain how to classify herself. "What I mean is," explained the clerk, "do you have a job, or are you just a ...? "Of course I have a job," snapped Emily. "I'm a Mum." "We don't list 'Mum' as an occupation... 'housewife' covers it," said the clerk emphatically.

I forgot all about her story until one day I found myself in the same situation, this time at our local police station. The Clerk was obviously a career woman, poised, efficient, and possessed of a high-sounding title like, "Official Interrogator" or "Town Registrar." "What is your occupation?" she probed. What made me say it, I do not know...

The words simply popped out. "I'm a Research Associate in the field of Child Development and Human Relations." The clerk paused, pen frozen in midair, and looked up as though she had not heard right. I repeated the title slowly, emphasizing the most significant words. Then I stared with wonder as my pronouncement was written in bold, black ink on the official questionnaire!

"Might I ask," said the clerk with new interest, "just what you do in your field?" Coolly, without any trace of fluster in my voice, I heard myself reply, "I have a continuing programme of research, (what mother doesn't), in the laboratory and in the field, (normally I would have said indoors and out). I'm working for my Masters, (the whole family), and already have four credits, (all daughters). Of course, the job is one of the most demanding in the humanities, (any mother care to disagree?) and I often work 14 hours a day, (24 is more like it). But the job is more challenging than most run-of-the-mill careers and the rewards are more of a satisfaction rather than just money." There was an increasing note of respect in the girl's voice as she completed the form, stood up, and personally ushered me to the door.

When I got home, buoyed up by my glamorous new career, I was greeted by my lab assistants -ages 10, 7, and 3. Upstairs, I could hear our new experimental model, (a 6-month-old baby), in the child-development programme, testing out a new vocal pattern. I felt I had triumphed over bureaucracy! And I had gone on the official records as someone more distinguished and indispensable to mankind than "just another Mum." Motherhood... What a glorious career! Especially when there's a title on the door.

Does this make grandmothers "Senior Research Associates in the field of Child Development and Human Relations", and great grandmothers "Executive Senior Research Associates"??? I think so!!! I also think it makes Aunts "Associate Research Assistants".




FROM THE CHURCH MOUSE




National Day of Prayer 2021

2 Corinthians 3:17 Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty.

This is the 70th year of the incredible blessing of observing the National Day of Prayer.

Yes, we are richly blessed to have a law that has proclaimed a day of prayer for our nation each year since the first observance as the law was signed in 1952! Decades later, Ameri-



ca still needs our prayers. We need to be praying for all people, every day, for all seven mountains of influence and more, because people are still in need and the Church is still called to a prayer, care, share lifestyle. First and foremost, people need to hear the message and experience the love of our Lord Jesus Christ. All have sinned and fall short, but God's arm is not short, and we have been sent to show and share His message of LOVE, LIFE, and LIBERTY.

Before God even spoke, "Let there be..." He loved you and me. God is love. Grace Has a New Nursery




