"God Will Be with You Wherever You Go", Joshua 1:9

Every year, the last Monday of May is kept as Memorial Day. This day is the day for remembering and honoring those who died in war. For some people, it may be remembered as just one of the holidays, but it is a tearful day for the families of fallen Soldiers to remember the painful memories. Some of you may think that Memorial Day has nothing to do with Christians, but "Memorial Day" has spiritual significance. On this Day, we remember that the freedoms we enjoy are possible only through the risks taken and sacrifices made by those in the military, especially those who have given their lives in defense of freedom. To express gratitude to them, there is an idiom widely used in the United States, "Freedom Is Not Free" which is engraved into one of the walls at the Korean War Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C. And this reminds us of Jesus Christ who died on the cross to set us free from sin and death. Indeed, the freedom that we have in Jesus Christ is not free because Jesus had to pay for us through his death on the cross.

I was commissioned as a U.S. Army reserve chaplain (1LT) on July 7, 2020. I have served almost two years, worked in my unit (467 Medical Detachment; Combat and Operational Stress Control in Madison) and supported our Soldiers. Also, it is time to get my officer's training in South Carolina for 3 months (May 18 to

SUMMER SKIN CARE

With summer, many people spend more time outdoors. That increased time in the sun and the sun being more direct in summer, our skin is more vulnerable to damage. Taking some simple steps to prevent that damage will help keep skin supple and healthy.

First, drink lots of water. Staying hydrated will help the skin from within, keep the body fueled, and promote kidney health. Avoid sugary drinks. Remember that caffeine actually tends to dehydrate and avoid too many sports drinks as they have salts that can make your body retain fluids.

Use sunscreen regularly and reapply periodically throughout the day if you are out for extended periods.

Drink juices, especially those that offer antioxidants, as they boost collagen, provide vitamins C and E, help hydrate, and rid the skin of free radicals.

Wash the face daily to remove excess oil. Consider exfoliating a couple of times per week, avoid heavy makeup, use a good toner, and MOISTURIZE.

Remember to care for lips and feet. Chapstick is available with SPF protection.

Enjoy the summer sun, just take steps to avoid skin damage.
