Pastor Krystal's Corner

On Fire! Pentecost

"This is a Church on Fire" by Hillsong says "This is a church on fire, this is the Holy Spirit flame."

As you know, I love Pentecost, and not just because I get to set things on fire (though that is a bonus!)

Pentecost Sunday represents an ending as well as a beginning: the end of the "Great Fifty Days" of the Easter Season (*Pentecost* means "the 50th day" in Greek) and the beginning of the early church. For the early church, Pentecost was the second most important part of the Christian year after Easter. Pentecost also gives us an opportunity to ask ourselves the question, "What is our community `on fire' about?"

So why do we light things on fire during Pentecost, other than to satiate Pastor Krystal's need for fire? The Holy Spirit is takes on three forms (the Confirmands should know what these are)... dove, wind, and fire. On the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came down in the form of fire. So on Pentecost, we light fire in remembrance of that act.

What about in our church. Where is the fire in our church? Where is the Holy Spirit at work? Where are we bursting at the seams with energy, compassion, justice, and love?

What about us individually? What is stirring within us? What is our passion for ministry? What sets us ablaze (or at least warms our hearts)? Where is the Holy Spirit burning our feet to go do, go work, go preach the good news, or go minister?

The church is on fire!

May the Holy Spirit work in surprising ways in our church this year!

Competency and Civil Rights

When we see our loved ones become confused or show signs of not caring properly for themselves, we are left feeling helpless. Should our loved one suffer a heart attack it becomes quite clear rather quickly that we need to take immediate action and seek help. It is not so easy to know when to intervene as a person becomes incompetent. Our society strongly supports preserving people's civil rights but when person becomes of danger to themselves or others, something needs to be done.

Mental incompetence is a result of mental illness, senility or a physical condition that prevents a person from managing their own affairs.

When legal documents, such as power of attorney, are in place the physicians can facilitate the process to activate them. If the documents are not in place legal steps can be taken to declare incompetence. These steps include: 1) a motion for a competency hearing, 2) a psychiatric or psychological evaluation, and 3) a competency hearing. Probate courts usually handle competency hearings and appoint a "guardian ad litem". Taking on this role is a wonderful way to help care for loved ones. Talk to their medical provider if you feel your loved one can no longer make safe decisions. The physician can arrange for you to work with a social worker to get through the process.

On **Sunday, June 2nd**, we will welcome another group of Family Promise guests to stay with us for a week. One of the volunteer needs during each host week is to have at least 2 volunteers present during family time.

What happens during family time? Depending on the age of the guests, volunteers may read books, play games, bake treats, do simple crafts with the children, watch movies or have conversations with our guests. There is NO expectation that you prepare or bring something for family time. Some evenings, the guests may need to have more quiet time and retire to their rooms after a busy day at school or work. This is not a babysitting situation for our volunteers. Guests are always responsible for their children.

When is family time? It's from 6:30 - 8:45 pm each evening.

Where: Most of the interaction with the guests takes place in the lower level youth room or Fellowship Hall.

Volunteer Helpers: We welcome volunteers of any age as long as children are accompanied by an adult. Families are welcome to volunteer! Our Family Promise children guests love to interact and play with other kids. If you are new to volunteering, one of our experienced volunteers will be glad to partner with you the first time you stay.

How do I volunteer? Sign-up sheets are always available at the back of the church approximately 3-4 weeks before our next host week. Darcey Bedward is the coordinator of Family Time for our church. You may also contact her at 608-449-8207.

Are you giving to the church in all the ways you could or should be giving?

You may be supporting this year's budget, but what about the future of the church, missional support, and special projects? Are you providing for these as well?

I think of the church's assets and giving as an ice-cream cone. The church's assets such as the building, parsonage, and endowments as the cone. Essential, but not very appetizing all by themselves. Annual budget giving is the first scoop. It is needed and provides basic support and flavor to the church. However, too often, this is where we stop thinking about supporting the church.

What about other scoops? What about missions? Mission-related giving can include apportionments (sometimes paid with the annual budget, sometimes not), conference projects, Special Sundays, UMCOR, national and international advance projects and support of individual missionaries. Are you thinking about your offering for missions this year? These are usually donations over and above what is collected for the annual budget. What about planned giving?

Planned giving provides for the future of the church when you are no longer around. Have you included the church in your will or as a beneficiary to your investment accounts or life insurance? Ten percent is a good number, leaving plenty for your family.

Finally, what about special projects. Capital fundraising can support new ministry, ministry growth, new building or renovation and maintenance of existing structures. Remember the Imagine No Malaria campaign a couple of years back that raised over one million dollars?
