## THE INVITATION

The Woman's Society of Christian Service of the Methodist Church is the established organ through which all women of any Methodist church may find opportunity for service, worship, and fellowship.

Presented herewith is the program for 1959-60 for our Society, with a variety that provides "something for everyone". All members are invited, and urged, to take an active part in the whole program.

A most cordial invitation is extended, too, to all women of the church to come and join with us, as membership in the Society is open to any woman. If you cannot attend all meetings, feel free to come to those you can.

Regular meetings of the Afternoon Group are held on the first Thursday of each month, beginning with quiet meditation in the Sanctuary at 1:15 p.m.; followed by fellowship at 1:30 p.m., program and business meeting, in the church hall. Regular meetings of the Evening Group are held the first Monday of each month, beginning at 8:15 p.m. with the business meeting, followed by the program and a fellowship period.

## THE PURPOSE

The purpose of the Woman's Society of Christian Service shall be to unite all women of the church in Christian living and service; to help develop and support Christian work among women and children around the world; to develop the spiritual life; to study the needs of the world; to take part in such service activities as will strengthen the local church, and improve civic, community, and world conditions. To this end this organization shall seek to enlist women, young people, and children in this Christian fellowship, and to secure funds for the activities in the local church, and support of the work undertaken at home and abroad for the establishment of a world Christian community. ## ABOUT SOME OF THE EVENING GROUP PROJECTS

KOREA - Each year we send a package of needed articles to Korea to benefit the Methodist Mission, c/o Miss Esther Laird, at Taejan.

THE NEEDLEWORK GUILD - A nation-wide organization which provides clothing for the needy. At the time of the Guild's annual "in-gathering" our members contribute new garments.

CHURCH-WIDE FAIR - An innovation this year will be an old-fashioned country fair to be held November 20-21, sponsored by our group, with church-wide participation in the various booths which will feature hand-made articles, including home-canned delectables and baked goods. Also, there will be a "green thumb" booth, cards and gift wrappings, a parcel post counter, and a white elephant table. Snacks and refreshments will be available on Friday, and a chicken dinner will be served Saturday night.

JEFFERSON PARK - A Methodist Mission and Church in East Harlem. At Christmas we send toys to the underprivileged children served by this mission, and during the year we collect used clothing for both adults and children.

BROOKLYN METHODIST HOME FOR THE AGED - At Easter we remember these folks with small gifts.

LEPROSY MISSION - Periodically we collect men's worn white shirts and send them to the Leprosy Mission for use by patients.

SPRING PARTY - A purely social event held in spring for our members, their husbands, and guests.

STRAWBERRY FESTIVAL AND PENNY FAIR - A fellowship evening for the whole congregation. Held in June.

## ABOUT THE PROJECTS OF THE AFTERNOON GROUP

BIRTHDAY CALENDAR: This project has been going since 1952, but since last year it has been sponsored by the Afternoon Group. Ads are solicited from local business firms, and names from members and friends. A calendar is given to each family unit inserting names, and they make a handy place for notations of all kinds. Proceeds this year will help refurbish the parsonages.

RUMMAGE SALES: Fall and Spring rummage sales have been held for more years than most of us can remember. Proceeds go to the group's general budget.

BROOKLYN METHODIST HOME FOR THE AGED are recipients each year of gaily wrapped Christmas gifts that are brought by the members to their own Christmas party.

THE NEEDLEWORK CIRCLE receives a complete layette, and sometimes extra pieces of clothing, from the members each year.

THE SPRING DINNER is a fund-raising project that offers the church family an opportunity to "eat out" and enjoy good fellowship at the same time.

MISSION STUDY CLASSES take a special offering at the fellowship table and, at the end of the year, send the money to the mission stations as recommended in the action-from-study folder put-out by the Woman's Division of Christian Service.

CANCER DRESSINGS for the Nassau County Cancer Society are sewed regularly by a small group under Mrs. Ernest Jaeger's leadership. Quantities reach close to the 10,000 mark each year.

CATERING the Men's Communion Breakfast is a service this group has done since the beginning. Now they are joined by members of the Evening Group.
