Stewardship Moment

"There are three conversions necessary to every man: the head, the heart, and the purse." Attributed to Luther, though yet to be located in his vast writings, this statement echoes what Jesus taught about hearts and treasures. He said, "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." (Matthew 6:21; Luke 12:34)

But which conversion comes first? I submit that the order is this: first the head, then the purse, then the heart. Let's explore this topic. Our Lord Jesus Christ dwelt among us to save us. He took on our flesh, fulfilled the demands of the law in our place, became sin for us, and suffered torture and death on our behalf. He did this in order that we would be free from sin, death, and hell. He gives us what He accomplished through Baptism, Absolution, and the Lord's Supper. And so, He doesn't just do it for us but gives it to us. He makes what He did ours by making us His. Thus, we are called by His name: Christians. We have a new life! Through the preaching of Law and Gospel, God grants us repentance to change our minds. It's a conversion of the

mind. We are called to turn away from our sins and turn toward Him for forgiveness, life, and salvation. For when God calls us away from something, He is, at the same time, calling us to something. And thus, He calls us to a new life, with new deeds. This is the conversion of the purse. Jesus said that "it's easier for a camel to enter through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God." (Matthew 19:24) "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." Notice that our hearts follow our treasures, not the other way around. As Christians, God calls us to invest our treasures in His Kingdom to ensure that the gospel is preached and the sacraments are administered. He calls us to share all good things with the one who teaches us the doctrines of Christ. He calls us to be generous in giving to the church-- it is more blessed to give than to receive.

So where is your treasure? If it is not invested in the kingdom of God, then the only response is repentance – a conversion of the heart – and to begin doing just that. And as our Lord promised, where your treasure is there your heart will be also.

This is not to say that you earn your way into heaven. It is simply to say that as Christians, those who have been made to be temples of the Holy Spirit, who have been given a new life in Christ, who are dead to sin and now alive in Him, we are actually to live – think (conversion of the mind), do (conversion of the purse), and be (conversion of the heart) – a new life in Him. And when you fail, know that God in Christ loves and forgives you and still calls you away from that and to Himself.

Lewis pointed out in Mere Christianity, "If you read history, you will find that the Christians who did the most for the present world were just those who thought most of the next. The apostles went out on foot to convert the Roman Empire, the English Evangelicals abolished the slave trade; all left their mark on earth, precisely because their minds were occupied with heaven. "When Christians cease to think of the other world they become so ineffective in this. Aim at heaven and you will get earth 'thrown in'; aim at earth and you will get neither.

Do Strict Parents Make Sneaky Kids? By: Abby Watts, a parent with teens.

I went to high school with a kid who had super strict parents. His curfew was 9 p.m., so he'd sneak out. He wasn't allowed to listen to pop music, so he stashed his CDs in his sock drawer. His 10-year-old brother even hid his toys under his pillow at night. As a kid, I just felt like his parents were unfair. Now, as I make rules for my kids, I wonder if I'm driving them to rebel. Do strict parents really make sneaky kids? These 3 clues will lead you to the answer.

Clue #1: Ask yourself this question. Are you raising a sin concealer or a sin confessor?

Rules don't make kids sneaky any more than laws make citizens commit crimes. What does make your kids sneaky is when they cannot talk to you because you won't listen, don't try to empathize, and won't acknowledge their points of view. They think they have to be sneaky because coming to you is pointless or will just make you pull the reins tighter.

Clue #2: Examine perception versus reality.

Even though you think you're open-minded, your child might still say, "There's no use talking to my parents. They never do what I want and they always tell me I'll understand when I'm older." As parents, we need to go out of our way not only to tell our kids they can talk to us about anything but also to make ourselves available when they do want to talk. That means slowing down, being home when our kids are home, and putting our phones away. **And when our kids do share a mistake or some drama with us, our reaction is key.** If we blow up, we might never get the opportunity again.

If you're not sure where you stand, there's no harm in asking your son or daughter, "Do you think you can tell me everything?" "What keeps you from talking to me about things?" That could be the start of a conversation that changes your relationship.

Clue #3: Reflect on your rules.

Rules should be a reflection of our love for our kids, not just a way to exercise authority. If your kids have no time for fun, don't experience natural consequences because you've got them on too short a leash, and you don't let them make any choices, it might be time to loosen up. This is especially true if you find your once-honest child lying frequently.

How do you talk to your kids about why you've made certain rules? ASK YOUR CHILD... Do you feel like you can talk to me about anything? Why or why not? Finally, end your day talking with your child.

What if you spent just a couple of minutes every morning thinking about how to parent well and a couple of minutes every night talking to your child? We know from experience it would change your relationship with your child.

- → "What can you do if you get angry and feel a fight coming on?" → "Do you feel like I compare you to others?"
- → "Do you think it's OK to feel sad?" → "Can you think of a time when things turned out differently than you expected?"
- → "What makes you want to be friends with someone?" → "What makes it easy or hard to talk to someone?"
- → "As a parent, what's the number one rule you'll give your kids?" → "How do you feel when someone tells you what to do?"
