1. District scholarships for Pastoral and Church Worker Students—\$30,000.

2. Alaska LCMS Mission Church Outpost—\$5,000 for transportation costs of pastors to serve at Prince of Peace Lutheran mission outpost in Seldovia, AK.



3. Lizzie Comfort Dog, Savannah, GA—\$10,000 for ministry resources to bring the love of Christ to hurting people.

4. Live UCF Outreach and Engaging University Students—\$8,500 for outreach events and training with students at the University of Central Florida, Valencia, and Seminole State.

5. Mill Neck's Deaf Christian Education Afterschool Program—\$3,000 to help fund an afterschool education program to provide Christian-based curriculum in American Sign Language.

6. Body and Soul Ministry Food Pantry—\$10,000 to buy large print and Spanish translation Bibles, replace aging refrigeration, and replace worn carpeting at Forest Oaks Lutheran Body and Soul Ministry.

7. Holy Trinity Food Pantry—\$10,000 for food and clothing for those in need and to purchase or repair equipment to maintain fresh food per government regulations.

9. Making Jesus Known in the US Ethnic Communities—\$10,000 to help fund education costs at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, of ethnic student/church workers passionately sharing the Gospel among their immigrant/ethnic communities.

10. Luke Comfort Dog, Alpharetta, GA—\$10,000 to help cover transportation and housing of the team during disasters, tragedies, and other events they are called to serve.
