COUNSELOR'S CORNER

SR. COUNSELOR- Rev. Alan Koch

Gabriel said to Daniel during a terrifying vision, "**Do not be afraid**, Daniel...." (Daniel 10:12). To the Virgin Mary, "**Do not be afraid**, Mary; you have found favor with God. You will conceive and give birth to a son, and... call him Jesus." (Luke 1:30-31). To the shepherds on the Bethlehem hillside, "**Do not be afraid**. I bring you good news.... Today... a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord." (Luke 2:10-11). I believe that same angel commands us the same: "**Do not be afraid.**"

In the koine Greek of the New Testament, two different words say, "do not be afraid". One means "do not start being afraid", while the other recognizes someone is already afraid, but it is time to stop being afraid. Today with COVID=19, many are already afraid, and even scared to death! Frozen in their tracks for fear of getting it or giving it to someone they love. This human response is normal, however, as Christians we also need a faith-filled response! If our humanity wins, we could shelter in place for years. Let's see how God would have us respond:

God gave leadership of Israel to Joshua. He is preparing to enter the Promised Land, where the same "giants" lived as they did forty years earlier when Israel had refused to enter. What is different for Israel now? Why not still afraid to cross the Jordan River? Read Joshua 1:1-9 and see if you can find the difference: After the death of Moses..., the LORD said to Joshua..., "Moses my servant is dead. Now..., go over this Jordan, you and all this people, into the land that I am giving to... the people of Israel.... No man shall be able to stand before you all the days of your life. Just as I was with Moses, so I will be with you. I will not leave... you. Be strong and **courageous**, for you shall cause this people to inherit the land that I swore to their fathers to give them. Only **be strong and very courageous**.... This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it; ...you will make your way prosperous...; you will have good success. Have I not commanded you? Be strong and

courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."

How does God want you to react to a threat such as we are experiencing today? Israel had not quite accepted him as their leader, he had not proven himself. God said, "I have your back! I am giving you this land. No man shall be able to stand before you. If you follow my commands in the Books of Moses, you will have good success." So, "be strong and courageous"! I can't imagine a better response to our uncertainties today! Don't cower because of what might happen. Be strong and courageous! Don't freeze in place out of fear. Be strong and courageous! Don't stop all activities in your life. Be strong and courageous! Stop being afraid! Fear causes us to make some pretty silly decisions. Be strong and courageous!

BUT don't be careless. Don't tempt the Lord by putting yourself into situations that almost guarantee you will develop a problem. No more than driving 100 mph through a neighborhood and expecting nothing to go wrong, don't place yourself in harm's way regarding the virus.

Go to church. My congregation has been back for our regular two services, since Mother's Day. Wear a mask. Wash your hands often. But stop being afraid! Be strong and courageous! You can even share the peace and give someone a hug if you are wearing a mask and turn your head away from the face of the other person! Wearing masks makes hymns of praise a bit muffled, but they are still hymns of praise!! The choir even sings with masks. It is wonderful! Serve the Lord with gladness!
