

Let us Introduce Our Guest Speakers

Rev. Rosemarie Howell - On June 04, 1994, just shy of 28 years old, I gave my whole life and heart to Jesus Christ. I know that this is a bit of a cliché, particularly since I was raised up in the traditions of the Church (with the exception of my teenage years.) There has been always a deep longing in my heart for more than just merely going to church. This longing eventually took me on a personal journey which led me to taking a course called 'Faith Alive'. It was here that I had finally met with the Living God. Once I said yes to His call, and from that moment onward, it has always been my deepest desire for others to encounter Christ for themselves: to know Him, to be loved by Him and to love Him in return. This calling eventually led me to be ordained as a priest in 2014/2015. Upon meeting someone for the first time, I often introduce myself as Rev. Rose, but then quickly add, please just call me Rose. I see myself more as a priest of the people emphasizing more on the "people". I have found over the course of my ministry that God has gifted me with the gifts of pastoral care and prayer. I hope to exercise both of these gifts during this weekend.

I am a wife of 34 years to a kind-hearted man, George, who, unequivocally, supports me in everything I do; a mother of two children, and a grandmother of 5 grandchildren with one more on the way.

Melody Shologan – Melody was raised in a Christian home in Southern Alberta by her amazing parents, Les and Phyllis Handley. She married her high school sweetheart, Patrick Shologan, and together they had five children: Mark, Tara, Keith, Dana and Laura. Melody taught for five years in Picture Butte before her children were born, then returned to teaching in Rochester for the past 19 years. Melody currently has 11 grandchildren.

In 2001, tragedy struck when Melody and Patrick lost their two youngest children in a car accident, and then in 2010 after 39 and a half years of marriage, Patrick passed away.
