**Ash Wednesday** marks the start of **Lent** in the Western church and takes place 46 days before Easter. As the date of Easter is calculated on the cycles of the moon, the date of Ash Wednesday will vary from year to year.

**Ash Wednesday** is a Christian holy day of prayer and fasting and falls on the first day of Lent, the six weeks of penitence before Easter. Ash Wednesday is traditionally observed by Western\_Christians. It is observed by Catholics in the Roman Rite, Anglicans, Lutherans, Methodists, Moravians, and Independent\_Catholics, as well as by many from the Reformed faith (inclusive of the Congregationalist, Continental Reformed, and Presbyterian traditions).

**Ash Wednesday** derives its name from the placing of repentance ashes on the foreheads of participants to either the words "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" or the dictum "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." The ashes are prepared by burning palm\_leaves from the previous year's Palm\_Sunday celebrations.

The month of February is commonly known as the month of **Love**: flowers, candies, romantic gestures of affection which includes being taken out for dinner, etc....

Every single year since I've been married, my George will ask me, "What do you want for Valentine's Day?"

I will respond in turn, "If this is the only day you want to shower me with *love*, don't bother. I want to be loved every day of the year."

(George has given me permission to share)

Our little song and dance may seem abrupt to some, but not so. He asks me this because he loves me and wants to shower me with pretty things. I respond this way because he loves me, and I want his *love* every day of the year. Plus, gifts mean nothing to me. We have spent our lives trying to convey a deeper meaning of "*Love*" to each other. *Love* is so much more that flowers or candy. It is about giving of ourselves daily to the other. Yes, even when we don't want to! Yes, we bicker. Yes, we sometimes fail to show our love and only think about ourselves. This is true, but we are still here after 34 years of marriage so we must be doing something right. And I might add, showering a person with gifts is wonderful things too if that is your *Love* language!

Gary Chapman in his book, "The Five Love Languages: How to Express Heartfelt Commitment to Your Mate", conveys to his reader that we need to learn how to show our love to another person in a meaningful way to the person receiving that love. He says there are basically five *love* languages:

- "Words of affection"
- "Quality time"
- "Receiving gifts"
- "Acts of services"
- "Physical touch"

This book goes way beyond a "how-to book" for a good marriage. Its main principle is to discover we are made in the image of God and see each other through the eyes of the Father. He has made each one of us uniquely. Who is the person in front of you? How can you express your *love* to them in a way that shows "them" that they are *love*d? Giving flowers to a person who craves your attention is missing the person in front of you. This basic principle should be applied to your spouse, your children, a family member, church member, employee and so on.

I have discovered for myself that I need words of affirmation, quality time, and physical touch. When one of these actions are missing for extended period of time, I start to wane in my spirit. This has taken me years to discover this truth and applies in every aspect of my life, including my relationship with God.

When I think of the word "**Love**" it is the very core of our God and is expressed through his Son, Jesus! By sending Jesus for us, we experience all aspects of love:

- When I am in need of a word of encouragement, his word will jump up from the pages of his Book and speaks to my life in that moment.
- When I am in need of his time, by the Spirit, he will come and sit with me.
- When I am in need of his gifts for service to others, The Holy Spirit fills me with the special abilities for that moment.
- When I am in need to feel his touch, I can feel a gentle (and sometime, not so gentle) brush of wind across my face
