Minister's message

I was out hunting with a friend in Baker Lake. It was wintertime and I was out on a snowmobile. As it can in the Arctic, the wind started to pick up at an alarming rate. As the wind started to pick up, the snow started to blow and soon the hills were difficult to see. I thought it best that we head back. I stopped the snowmobile to tell my partner only to realize he was nowhere in sight. To make matter worse by this time the storm had developed into a whiteout. I suddenly realized how foolish I was. We were only going for a few hours and I went out without tent, sleeping bag or extra gas. I was lost in the tundra, in a blizzard without proper equipment and I did not even know the direction home. For one of the few times in my life I was very much afraid. I decided to go in circles hoping to find a landmark that I would recognize.

For about an hour and a half I continue to circle, getting more nervous and edgy. I could tell my fuel was getting low. I stopped. And before I allow panic to overcome me I closed my eyes, took a deep breath feeing the icy air on my lungs. I began to pray. If you ask me what I said I will admit I do not remember. What I do remember is the sense of calmness that overcame and a sense that God was present. For a moment I sat there in the windy whiteness of the blizzard feeling the presence of God around me. Then I started out again.

I began circling. After about 15 minutes I came upon an old gravel road. I knew the road. There are very few roads around Baker Lake. The problem was I did not know which way to go. If I went the correct way it would lead me to the main road and to home. If I went the other way the road ended in literally the middle of nowhere. This time in a calm voice that surprised me I ask God to direct me in the way to go. One way looked the same as the other: White. White everywhere. So, I started out in one direction trusting that God was guiding. About 20 minutes later I met the main road and from there the way home was easy.

That incident took place about 26 or 27 years ago, I still remember is clearly. I was in a serious crisis and I had no idea what to do, or what would happen. Today we live in a crisis time. The corona virus is sweeping our land and the world. Many are dying, and we are becoming more nervous and anxious not knowing what will happen. Our way of life has been changed. The securities that surrounded us seem to be dropping away. It is in times like these we need to remember our Lord's words at the end of Matthew; "Surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." It is in the hard times of life (and this is one of those times) that we need to remember God is with us.

God the Holy Spirit guides us, God the Son walks beside us, sometimes carrying us through the rough times, and God the Father ever holding us in his hand, surrounding us with his love and mercy. We need to stop and take a moment allowing God to flood us lives, our souls with his presence. We need to let God have control and move forward as the Church, trusting in his leadership, His guidance, His mercy and His love. God never promised to take us out of hard times, but he promises to journey with us and if necessary carry us through the crisis of life, equipping us with all we need to do his will and in doing his will we find contentment.
