A Journey With Jesus

Meditating on discipleship and Holy Week

Our goal as Christians is to become disciples of Christ—to follow where Jesus would lead our lives.

This desire to not only follow, but wholly imitate, Jesus' footsteps is magnified by the events of Holy Week. The story of



Jesus' final hours, the institution of the Eucharist at a meal with his friends, his prayerful vigil in the garden, and his subsequent arrest, betrayal, and crucifixion has inspired generations of Christians to travel the Stations of the Cross for centuries.

Where some Christians have been fortunate to walk the *Via Dolorosa* ("the path of sorrow") in Jerusalem—retracing the historic route where Jesus was lead from his trial to his crucifixion atop Golgotha, others have reenacted these events by following the retelling of the events of Good Friday along the Stations of the Cross in their local context.

Given the profundity of the events of Good Friday, this desire to follow the path that Christ trod makes sense, for I think it draws the enormity of salvation down to a personal scale.

"A perfect sacrifice for the whole world"

When I was in Fourth Grade, our church had a children's bible study led by two Episcopal Nuns. One week, we were asked to draw two pictures: one depicting a story from the Old

Our Palm Sunday service will follow our Children's Church format with a kidfriendly sermon and shorter prayers.

Later in the week, children are invited to participate in our Maundy Thursday service. This is a dinner program, where we eat foods Jesus and the Disciples may have enjoyed. There will be foot washing and Communion at this service.

On Good Friday, children are invited to stay after the 3PM Good Friday service for a special Children's Stations of the Cross. Tentatively scheduled from 4-4:30, this service will help children understand the importance of Good Friday as we look towards Easter Morning.

Sunday School Teachers Wanted

Interested in helping teach Lego Sunday School? Please let Fr. Matt or Kristy know, we're looking for more volunteers to help in this important ministry. Testament, and another from the New Testament. On the left side of the paper, I drew a picture of God's hand stretching down from heaven—not to touch Adam with the Divine spark as Michelango had, but to grab Abraham's hand before he sacrificed Isaac. On the right side, I drew Jesus' hand nailed to the cross. I called it "A perfect sacrifice for the whole world."

To this day, I have no idea what inspired me to draw that—except that even at ten years old, there was a part of me that needed God's salvation to be completely self-giving. Abraham was incredible in his faith...but what if I wasn't as faithful—would God reckon me as righteous? The only way God could make me perfect was if God didn't have to rely on my imperfections. For I believe, then and now, that God had to perform the hard work... it's up to us to accept that most gracious gift.

"We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you: because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world"

When we participate in the events of Holy Week, and especially when we pray the Stations of the Cross, what are we doing?

I believe that we are being drawn closer to God in gratitude for the saving acts of Christ. It is in retelling this story, in recreating these events, that we marvel at how God was able to bring us closer, to reunite humanity with the Almighty. As we move from Maundy Thursday through Good Friday, there is almost nothing that humanity gets right. Judas and Peter both betray Jesus, the disciples scatter and flee in fear—none of that matters. It isn't by our own merits that we are reconciled to God, it is only through the divine self-giving that God restores us.

As Holy Week invites us once more to ponder these events, we will do our best to share these stories with our parish family. This year, we will lead a special program "Journey with Jesus" during Holy Week. Beginning with a Children's Church service on Palm Sunday, "Journey with Jesus" will continue with a Maundy Thursday meal which explains the importance of Communion, before concluding with our traditional Good Friday Service and a special Children's Stations of the Cross on Good Friday.

In sharing these stories, it is my hope that a new generation of Christians can greet the joy of Easter morning with the secure knowledge that we are each God's children.
