Soon they will all fall and the tree will be bare and appear to be dead. At that moment I had an epiphany, "But the tree isn't dead." Next spring it will bloom with pink flowers, and then green leaves." Death looks so final. But the epiphany for Christians is that death in reality is birth. We just bloom in another sphere, the sphere of the Kingdom of God.

Death and birth are like a woman who ages gracefully, skin marked by age spots, eyes duller and less twinkly, hair silver or white glimmering in the sun, she may have some wrinkles, but her heart is bright, her spirit joyous, and her soul healthy with the Holy Spirit which draws you to her. She is wise in her old age and she guides those younger than herself. She is full of life and all who see her only see her beauty. All the signs of aging are invisible to those who adore this woman of grace. And everyone who knows her and takes the time to stay a while with her, is uplifted and made better

continue to sin, because God's seed remains in them; they cannot go on sinning, because they have been born of God. ...¹⁸ We know that anyone born of God does not continue to sin; the One who was born of God keeps them safe, and the evil one cannot harm them.

Our heart is God's desire for each person who walks the face of the earth. And all those who seek God's desire for themselves, find it. All who ask God day and night for God's love to fill their being are filled, and they are in God and God in them, their hearts are illumined by the commandments of the Lord.

My gift to you this Christmas is this prayer from Pope Shenouda III, 117th Pope of Alexandria and Patriarch of the See of St. Mark, Shepherd of the Coptic Orthodox Church. May we pray this prayer many times, day and night, this winter, dying to our old selves, freeing us to journey toward birth of renewal in Christ.

Prayer: Grant me, O Lord, to love you. Remove the love of sin from my heart, and give me your love.




Holiday Dinner Blessings







