Dear Members & Friends of First Church:

As I read this year's Easter Gospel from Mark 16:1-8, I'm interpreting it in light of our young people's national response to the Parkland, FL shooting. As the sun rises, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome are on their way to the cemetery to anoint Jesus' body with spices (the method of embalming in Jesus' day). They're asking one another, "What will we do when we get to his grave? He's already been buried." I thought of our Congress and Senate talking among themselves after the Florida shooting and asking, "What can we do about this continual gun violence and these perpetual acts of murder?"



The women found Jesus' grave already opened. A young man was just sitting beside his grave, and the women didn't quite know what to do. The young man says to them, "Don't be astonished! You are looking for Jesus, aren't you? See, his grave is empty. Go and tell the other followers, especially Peter, that you will see Jesus in Galilee, just as he told you." As I listen to the voice of that first Easter messenger at the empty grave, I hear the collective young voices of Emma Gonzalez, David Hogg, Cameron Kasky, Alex Wind, and Jacqueline Coren from the February 18th Face the Nation interview. They are crying out to our national leaders and us to enact legislation that will support mental health care and ban assault weapons. They are marching for their lives. THEY MARCH FOR OUR LIVES! They are preaching a new beginning for our nation. They are lifting up a new way of life. They are living the resurrection of new hopes and possibilities for our common future. How will we respond to these new Easter messengers?

The Gospel of Mark tells us that the women ran away from Jesus' grave because they were confused and terrified. After all the events of Holy Week, who wouldn't have been in a state of shock? But then Mark ends his original resurrection story by saying, ". . . and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid" (Mark 16:8b). Will that be our response and the response of our national leaders to the horrific event of February 14, 2018, to run away in fear? Or will we continue to join our youth and March For Our Lives and Theirs?

Those are Easter questions.



Life triumphs over death! Love wins! Christ is risen! Alleluia! Alleluia! Christ is risen, indeed!




USHERS ARE NEEDED
