A New Sound for a New Year

Dear St. Paul Family,

One of our accomplishments from 2020 was being able to install a new sound system in the sanctuary. The old system had served its purpose but was beginning to age and wear out. Before the pandemic started, there were more and more complaints of folks not being able to hear the service very clearly. The old system was checked by professionals and the diagnosis was that the system was just wearing out. We got a quote and specifications on what was needed in a new system and what the cost would be.

As a congregation there was a very faithful response and we collected what was needed to not only make deposits but to fully pay for the new system. This past fall, the installation process began which had to be done in stages. As of this writing we now

have the new system in place and are training people to properly use it. We are continuing to work out the kinks as it is a learning curve for all of us. Your patience and understanding is appreciated as we make adjustments to fine tuning the sound quality in the sanctuary and the sound as well as the quality of our livestream but all in all folks are saying the sound is much better.

To date, we have a new sound system, new speakers, new cordless mics and a camera with the ability to record and livestream the services to our website and Facebook page. New microphones for the lectern and pulpit are currently on order and are scheduled to be installed the second week of this month. This should complete the process and at some point after that we will have a dedication ceremony for the new system asking for God's blessings as we use this to enhance the quality of our worship and in


VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

2021 Worship Assistants








The St. Paul Church Council met in person on Sunday, December 13, 2020 at 11:12am. Highlights from the meeting include:

What About Epiphany?!

Don't miss the of season Epiphany! Epiphany is season of light but is squeezed between Christmas and Lent. The message of this season ought to shine brightly for it teaches an important topic: the mission of the church. It progresses from bright star guiding the Magi to the shining dove at the Baptism of Jesus to the glory of the Transfiguration. The structure of the season proclaims the mission of God's people.

The story of the Magi is that of distant people coming to Christ. The light draws the wise men from far off to worship Him. The Church calls people who are isolated from God to come. But the invitation is not to some idea or theory but to "God in man made manifest" (ELW 310). The Church's mission is to call sinners to communion with the life-giving flesh of Christ.

The first Sunday after the Epiphany Church is aimed at that divine joy. takes us to the waters of the Jordan. There John baptized Jesus, who numbers Himself among sinners. The bright dove, the Holy Spirit, points out Christ in the water. Outreach to the world and into the Church points to the same water. Those whom the mission calls to join Christ and His Church are called to the light of Christ in Baptism.

The remaining Sundays of Epiphany focus on the ministry of Jesus. He is the light of the world. He preaches. He prays. He heals those afflicted by Satan. In other words, He does mission work. The Church does also, lesus also calls us the light of the world. The mission of the Church is like Jesus' ministry: long and patient. The Church's mission is not to simply bring in as many as we can through the front door. It is to keep shining the light of Christ through His word, season after season, so that those living in darkness may continue to see the great light.

The finale of the Epiphany season is the Transfiguration. God in flesh is at the center but now not Magi but the glorified saints of old and the trembling disciples surround Christ. The light that pointed to Jesus at His Baptism now shines through Him. This is the goal of the Church's work: to bring people into God's presence for eternity. The light of Transfiguration shows us how important the Church's work really is. The mission of the
