# NATURAL WEEDKILLER

AHHHH! Spring is here! The flowers are blooming and we are preparing planting beds or cleaning up our yards. God has given us a beautiful Earth and we need to work to keep it clean for ourselves and future generations. One of the dreaded Springtime jobs is weeding-UGGGH! Maybe you have used chemical weed killers. But, remember, those chemical leach down into the soil, aquifer and our creeks and streams. Instead of crawling around on your hands and knees yanking out the pesty plants, how about making your own natural weedkiller? It's inexpensive, easy to make and is so much more "earth-friendly."

Try this instead:

1 gallon vinegar

2 cups Epsom salt

1/4 cup Dawn dish soap (the blue original)

Mix the ingredients in an empty gallon jug and pour into a spray bottle. Spray in the morning, after the dew has evaporated and walk away. Go back after dinner and those weeds are gone! #### WHAT AN OPPORTUNITY!

As you may recall, Landon Travis, the grandson of Patty Burris, has been serving in the United State Marine Corp. His mother Amy has shared a letter outlining his experiences since his deployment to Norway right after Christmas 2021. She writes:

Landon's unit is now conducting convoys to return our logistical equipment to the USNS Sissler in preparation for their return home to the States. They are expected to finish Cold Response 2022 by the end of April. Cold Response is a biannual training exercise conducted in Norway with all of our NATO allies. 30,000 troops from 26 countries come together to train to overcome language barriers and be able to rely on each other in all situations, should there ever be a need. Landon trained with military personnel from Canada, Denmark, Great Britain, France, Belgium, the Netherlands, Italy, Greece, Turkey, Germany, Spain, Poland, the Czech Republic, Hungary, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Romania, Slovenia, Croatia, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Finland, Sweden and Norway. He spent his time enjoying daily snowfall, more than he has seen in his twenty years. It is still considered their snowy season through May. He got to eat reindeer stew and many healthy fish-related meals as the Norwegian military bases are surrounded by the ocean. Fish is their primary source of protein. Landon has enjoyed his time there but is looking forward to coming home.

We all join Amy Travis in praying that Landon return home safely and thank him for his service. There is a collage of Landon on the Bulletin Board outside the Church Office. HOO RAH!
