This is the best water day I have ever experienced at day camp. I'm glad I'm doing this service project. I can't wait to come back next year. We're glad we came to camp. This is the best vacation I've had in a long time. This is just a small sample of the comments heard from campers, counselors and retreaters alike as both our Agape Day Camp and Kure Beach retreat that was held at the end of July.

We didn't know until late spring if we would even be able to offer day camp this summer due to staffing shortages and uncertainty regarding what the updated guidelines for Covid-19 would be. When we did get the green light for camp, we put the word out here at St. Paul and other area churches for children to come. It worked out that we got 20 campers and 3 counselors from Camp Agape. It turns out that our week of day camp was also the biggest week for on-site camp at Agape and so sending us enough counselors was

going to be a challenge. Two of those counselors were not full time this summer but had served in years past and happened to be living in this area as students at Lenoir-Rhyne University. They took a week off from school (one of them is a nursing major who spent her spare time studying for an exam) to come and help us out. One of them was so impressed with our program she said she wants to sign up as a counselor again next summer and is going to specifically request our Startown site. Regarding the campers we usually have one or two who don't make it the whole week or who have to miss one or two days because of other things going on but this year all 20 campers came everyday and had a fun and faith filled time each day. We also were still able to offer some modified serviced projects for the middle school aged campers which keeps them engaged on a
