Waiting, Watching, Christmas is Coming

Dear St. Paul Family,

The season of Advent is upon us which means the countdown is on to the season of Christmas. Advent is the beginning of a new church year and is that time we say is a period of watching and waiting – anticipating the celebration of God's great birth event.

At the Hanging of the Greens service the last Sunday of November we kicked off the season of Advent by dedicating the signs and symbols of this holy season pointing us to Christmas. During that service I talked with the children about the importance of waiting – the reminder that even though Christmas carols are playing and decorations are going up at homes and businesses alike, it is not yet Christmas. We wait. Waiting and watching are sort of like boundaries that can give us discipline to be patient. I asked the kids if they like waiting in line and they responded they do not. I

admitted I don't care for it either — I find myself wondering how long this is going to take, is there a way the line can move faster, and then I think about everything else I want to get done after I get through the line. When it comes to waiting I think a good spiritual discipline is to see it not as an inconvenience or a nuisance but as an opportunity — an opportunity to pray, to reflect, to ponder, to practice patience and/or to just be — after all many of you have heard me say before we are called human beings not human doings.

This year we are not quite as locked down as we were last year and so many are looking forward to doing more things person to person – shopping, spending time with family, etc. We tend to notice how different businesses and houses have their places decorated. Often times the décor and decorations is done within the context of the business or the taste of the homeowner. Some decorations are cluttered, others sparse. Some decorations cover



A message of appreciation was sent to Pastor Ralph and the congregation from Dylan Lail for the gift card received as part of the College Care Ministry.




DON'T BE LATE!


ends and we do not stop welcoming and loving His Son because of manageable health precautions.
