# **Zoom Zoom Zoom... Who Are You?**

When you log into Zoom on Sunday mornings or other times, we want to live out our mission to be a welcoming and inclusive congregation by welcoming you by name. Did you know that each Sunday a Deacon is scrolling through each of those "squares" that represents a device to check on our congregation and learn who is joining us each week? There is something you can do that not only helps the Deacon who is taking attendance, but also to help newer attendees to learn

who you are. We suggest that when you log on, you pay special attention to your Zoom log in name listed at the bottom of your square and make sure it clearly identifies you instead of a generic name or just your email handle or simply "ipad." If it does not please RENAME your Zoom user name by right clicking on your name at the lower left corner of your square or using the 3 dots in the upper right hand corner and clicking "rename". Then type in your name (or family name or the names of those watching). You can do this regardless of whether you have an official Zoom account. Using your name (whether just your first name or your whole name) not only helps the Deacon and members of our congregation to better identify and welcome you, but it also sends a message of welcome to someone who is a first time visitor. This is especially important if you choose to keep your camera off for all or most of the meeting as we may have no other way of identifying you. In addition to your name, you can also add your pronouns after your name. For example, John Bartkowiak (he/him/his). This provides a special inclusive welcome to people of all gender identities. Our Zoom names are the equivalent of using our nametags if we were in person at church, so let's wear them proudly!
