#### Dr. Helga Baskett-Tippett

Our Guest Preacher today is Dr. Helga Baskett-Tippett. Dr. Tippett is Afro German. She received her master's and doctorate degrees in ministry from Howard University. While matriculating at Howard University School of Divinity, she received the Gandy Award in ministry. She worked in many fields most of them serving the inner-city community. She has served on the Board of Directors, for the Dinner Program for Homeless Women, worked with Planned Parenthood as a consultant on a Teenage Pregnancy Program for inner-city youth and parents in the local church; taught bible study classes for adults and senior high students. She has ministered to the HIV/AIDs community, the elderly and the under-served in Washington Metropolitan area. She lectured on the Practical Application of Ministry to university students, church groups and special interest groups. Dr. Tippett is certified by the National Association of Human Rights Workers. As a Professional Human Rights Worker, she volunteered over three hundred hours in that field.

Dr. Baskett-Tippett is currently a Member-In-Discernment working through the UCC ordination process. She has worked and preached in several churches throughout the Washington Metropolitan area including Holy Comforter Episcopal Church, Alfred Street Baptist Church, Faith Temple, Northeastern Presbyterian Church, here at UCC Seneca Valley, and at her own church, Peoples Congregational UCC Church. It is her firm belief that, "The only degree that matters in life is the one that allows others to feel the love, mercy and grace of God, who is always calling us to God's self."

Simply place your completed ballot in the return envelope, sign the oath on the envelope, seal the return envelope and take it to a drop off box in the county. Ballot drop off boxes will be delivered at different times. The drop boxes will be available through Tuesday, November 3rd. Your ballot must be dropped off by 8 pm on Tuesday, November 3rd.

Please make sure your oath is signed on the return envelope or the ballot will not count. Ballot drop off boxes are monitored and secured by trusted election officials. Ballots are retrieved from the boxes at least twice daily by election officials. The drop off boxes are not property of the United States Postal Service. If you have any questions, please contact your local election office. This list may be updated to include new drop

box locations as they become available. For location up dates, go to <u>elections.maryland.gov/2020</u>. *This list is subject to change.*
