### \*Opening Prayer

Liturgist: Holy God, it is time for a parade. It is time for a protest. It is time to walk through the crucible of Holy Week in the hopes that we too can be baked into your new creation. What will happen as we make this journey yet again? Will love rise, as it has before? Will the gathered crowds find nourishing sustenance in Jesus' words and actions? Will the authorities decide the Bread of Life is feeding too many people, exponentially sharing good news and hope for a better tomorrow that threatens their power? Will Your saving grace rise like steam from the oven encircling us in comfort? We think we know how this story goes, but what if we don't? Teach it to us anew and let us crack open the crust to find the goodness hidden inside of us all. Amen.

#### **Invitation to Confession**

Liturgist: Accountability and truth is needed for growth. God does not want us to wallow in guilt or drown in despair and shame. Instead, in this time of confession let us remember what we need to let go of, or heal from, in order to truly be whole, as individuals and as a society. Imagine God knowing we have fallen flat, and yet over and over again kneading the yeast of love into our lives until we rise again. Let us offer God the truth of our lives first in silence and then in unison prayer. (A chime calls us to a moment of silence)

# **Prayer of Confession**

People: Merciful and Saving God, we confess that we shout Hosanna because we do not know how to save ourselves. We feel overwhelmed by

the brokenness of humanity. We confess that even as we bake our bread we are afraid of getting burnt. We worry your fire will destroy us instead of transform us. We confess that we love a parade and anything else that distracts us, entertains us, and helps us ignore the pain of the week to come. Give us the nourishment that we need to sustain ourselves as we continue to struggle in the wilderness and at the foot of the cross. Amen.

#### **Words of Assurance**

Liturgist: The good news of the gospel is that Jesus did come to save us. He came to save us from ourselves and remind us of the abundant life God has promised us. When we are honest before God, God shares with us a feast of forgiveness. Broken bread that feeds our souls.
