Invitation to Confession

Liturgist: We seek to know who Jesus was and follow in his footsteps. Part of that journey requires us to be honest with ourselves and before God about the times when we have wandered away from the path Jesus sets before us. We seek God's grace for the moments when we have, as individuals and as a society, failed to live as Jesus taught us. We pause now to quiet our hearts in silence and then to ask for forgiveness and find hope in God's embrace. (A chime calls us to a moment of silence.)

Prayer of Confession

People: God of Forgiveness, hear now the confession of our sins. Our greed and anger often create enemies instead of friends. We sometimes fail to offer comfort and aid to those who are afraid and beat down by the burdens of life. We can be as blind and willful as Saul to the pain and the destruction we create. Forgive us, merciful One. Give us sight to see with your eyes, that we may bring hope and peace to our world. Amen.

Words of Assurance

Liturgist: God forgives us our shortcomings and sends deliverance through Christ, just as Jesus forgave Saul and used him to spread the gospel. Feel the love God showers upon you and know that your ministry to others makes a real difference in this world.

Offertory Invitation

Liturgist: We invite you at this time to share God's abundance—in person in the offering plates at the doors or online or in any way that you feel called to do so. We come with our own special gifts. We come as a gifted congregation, marked by abundance. We make our offering for our community of faith and for the wider world.

Offertory Prayer

People: Holy One, you transformed the life of Saul. He was converted to your work as a disciple. We, too, have been transformed by your love. You earnestly listen for our daily response to your steadfast presence. Open our hearts so that we may walk consciously with you each day. We lift up this offering in the name of the Risen Christ. Amen.

Invitation to Communion

Pastor: Come to this table no matter who you are or what your journey to this moment has been. Come to this table celebrating your background, celebrating who you love, celebrating your age and place in life, and celebrating your uniqueness. Come to this table bringing all that you are — with your fears and your hopes and your heart on your sleeve; for this is God's Table, and God's love is always guaranteed. It is real, and it is strong, and it is for you. At this table, God makes us into a community in the Risen Christ, equipping us for the heartbreak and injustice of this world. So come to this table. Love has risen and Christ is ready to share.

Pastor: Come to the deep place in your life that Christ shows you.

People: We come, searching for nourishment.

Pastor: Come to the daybreak of hope.

People: We come even when we cannot see clearly.

Pastor: Come to join in community.

People: We come to a place of warmth and caring.

Communion Prayer

Pastor: On this May Day morning we remember that Jesus of Nazareth ate breakfast at his mother Mary's table, and never forgot that receiving a meal that is given is a holy way to begin every day.

We remember that Jesus taught at a table while Mary of Bethany listened, and that Mary of Magdala provided from the depths of gratefulness and generosity for the meals of all the followers.

We remember a rhythm in tambourine Miriam gave to every Passover, and that Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, broke the unleavened bread of that old commemoration of freedom, and offered a cup of new covenant, poured out for everyone in the upper room, and for everyone wading through sorrows or dancing for freedom who is willing to eat and drink now in his name for the life-giving of the world.

(People online are invited to mimic my actions as I consecrate the elements.)

We remember that on the night in which he gave himself up for love and justice, he sat at supper with his disciples. While they were eating, he took a piece of bread. Jesus said a blessing broke it, and gave it to them with the words, 'This is my body. Given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.'

Later, he took a cup of wine, blessed it and gave thanks for it. Jesus said, 'This cup is God's forgiveness poured out for you and for all people. Drink from it, all of you, to remember me'.

Holy God, you give us what we need, a simple breakfast or a feast, the strength just to go on or the outlet for our great joy. Send your Spirit upon this bread to be sacred, in memory and in truth, and on this cup that we may drink in your love. Amen.

Sharing the Bread and Cup

(Those in the pews are invited to come forward and get the communion elements and then return to your seats. We will bring the elements to those who cannot come forward for any reason. Please wait to consume the elements until all are once again seated. Those at home can ready themselves until we all eat the bread and drink the juice/wine together.)

Prayer of Thanksgiving

People: God, we give you thanks for helping us to see, for showing us how to love even in the midst of persecution, for serving us and teaching us how to serve others, and for meeting us not only at this table but at all our tables. We accept your call to feed the spirits, minds, and bodies of all your people, and to share the good news of the gospel with all the world. Amen
