Invitation to Confession

Liturgist: Sometimes we make mistakes. Sometimes we do things we shouldn't do. Sometimes we even forget or fail to do some things we know we should do. In those moments we may feel guilty or sad or angry at others or ourselves. When we come to church, we get to admit our mistakes. Not to feel badly about them, but to be forgiven and to learn from them. God loves us and wants to help us make the world a better place and to be happy ourselves. In this time, we are honest with God and know we are forgiven. We start with quiet when we hear the sound of the chime. (A chime calls us to a moment of silence.)

For this we are truly sorry and ask your patience as we learn and strive for ways to be more inclusive and celebrate all in this wondrous world.
