Call to Worship

Liturgist: As we come together for worship let us create the time and space we

need to sit with God and hear the whispers of the Spirit.

People: Let us sit together under Deborah's palm tree and make space to listen.

Liturgist: Let us hear the stories of our ancestors in faith who listened to the still

speaking voice of God and responded. Let us consider how we fit into

their story even as we write our own.

People: In times of struggle and in times of peace God is present with us. In this

hour we will pay attention to God tugging on hearts and calling us to a different way of life. Let us trust that through this process we can sift through the chaos of this world and align ourselves with the movement

of God.

Opening Prayer

Liturgist: God of our Ancestors, sometimes the stories in the Bible confuse us. The scriptures tell of wars and peace and oppression and violence and we are not sure how to make sense of it all. Today help us to listen to Deborah's story and find reassurance in your steadfast presence with her. Help us to remember her example of sitting and waiting for your wisdom and listening for your word. Show us how to create the space we need to connect with you. Give us the strength to stand firm in our calling to justice and love while also being open to your wisdom and the voice of the Spirit calling us to continue to walk in the way of Jesus. Amen.

Invitation to Confession

Help us to grow even more into Christ's likeness, that we will bear his love and truth to the world. We pray in his name. Amen.

Words of Assurance

Liturgist: Over and over again the Bible reminds us that God forgives. God offers mercy to all, the deserving and undeserving. Know that you are forgiven, offered renewal, and loved beyond measure.

Pantry Project Update

Hi everyone, we wanted to give you a quick update on the youth service project. First, we are thrilled that we have received the grant of \$750 from the Potomac Association and a generous gift of \$200. This will go towards buying the supplies to start the pantry, such as the storage shed, racks, and an initial stock of various items such as diapers, feminine hygiene products, etc. The youth will meet towards the end of July to discuss next steps, which include buying the supplies, setting up the pantry, and publicizing it in the community. We hope to get the pantry set up by late August. If you are interested in helping us with setting up/supervising the project, we would welcome your participation and feedback.
