Prelude

*Call to Worship

Liturgist: We have come here to journey together.

People: We walk together and promise to help one another as we go. (Walk in place.)

Liturgist: Even when the path heads uphill,

People: We climb towards the truth and follow the way of justice. (Climbing a steep mountain.)

Liturgist: We watch for signs that God is still speaking and beckoning us on. **People: The Spirit lights the fire where we warm our hands and hearts.** (Warm hands by fire.)

Liturgist: Though there are fierce currents around us on the river of life,

People: We pray God carries us through and helps us to trouble the waters as we experience both safe harbors and choppy seas. (*Paddling a canoe*) Liturgist: We have come here to journey together.

People: Let us go with God and prepare ourselves to experience the Holy. (Raise hands up to the sky.)

*Opening Prayer

Liturgist: God of the Journey, during this next month we'll follow a path together to learn about how we can trust you, grow in our faith, and be a community together. We will have adventures together. Sometimes the trail may seem challenging, or we might not be sure where we are going. But always we ask you to accompany us as we go so that none of us ever have to journey alone. Help us to have open hearts to all that you want to teach us. Give us the strength to take one step at a time to get to our destination. Provide us with a map so we will know where we are going and how to get there. Let your ancient scriptures help guide us on our way. We are ready for a great adventure as we head out on the trail. Help us to listen, learn, explore, and grow. Amen.

Invitation to Confession

Liturgist: We all want to stay on the path of light and truth and hope, but sometimes we get lost. Our time of confession helps us to admit our struggles and find our way back to the route towards love and justice. We begin as the chime calls us to a moment of silence. (A chime calls us to a moment of silence.)

Prayer of Confession

People: God of Hope, all too often we trip and fall or get waylaid on the journey you put before us. Forgive us for going it alone and for ignoring the map you have given us in scripture. We confess that we stumble when the ground beneath us gets muddy. Too often we decide to go off on our own and stop paying attention to where you are leading us on the trail. We

leave others behind when we should be accompanying them. We get overwhelmed when the journey seems never-ending. Help us to reclaim the route that leads towards transformation and redemption and find our way back to you. Amen.

Communion Invitation

Pastor: Come travelers in life

to every table where you are welcome.

Come dusty or dressed up, hungry or full.
Come lonely or in company, awkward or at ease.
Come to receive what is given,
to offer your peace and kindness,
to say the words that are in your heart.

Come to this table as host and guest, even as Christ is Guest and Host, for Communion is your gift to give and to receive, a piece of bread and peace of heart, the full cup of compassion, and strength for any new road.

Communion Prayer

Pastor: We remember some old instructions as if they were meant for us.

Jesus told his disciples to carry no purse, for they (and we) are rich enough.
Jesus told them to leave the suitcases. for they (and we) have holy roller bags.
Jesus told them no sandals necessary in a community that washes feet.

Jesus told them to offer peace, and to speak so anyone who hears knows they listen to God.

We remember that Jesus calls us harvest-gatherers and lambs, and we remember the Passover Supper with lamb and bitter herbs, bread from grain and fruit of the vine, and then gave them to us all to remember Love on every road and every homecoming.

(People online are invited to mimic my actions as I consecrate the elements.)

We remember that on the night in which he gave himself up for love and justice, he sat at supper with his disciples. While they were eating, he took a piece of bread. Jesus said a blessing broke it, and gave it to them with the words, 'This is my body. Given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.'

Later, he took a cup of wine, blessed it and gave thanks for it. Jesus said, 'This cup is God's forgiveness poured out for you and for all people. Drink from it, all of you, to remember me'.

In sanctuaries and living rooms, we rest our hands lightly upon these elements which we set aside today to be a sacrament. Let us ask God's blessing upon them, upon us and upon all those who are in our prayers this morning.

God, send your Spirit, upon every piece of every loaf so it is the Bread of Heaven and pour your Love into every cup so it is the Cup of Blessing. Strengthened, may we become both travelers and welcomers on your holy way, healed and healers, comforted and comforters, rich in hope and givers of hope, in the name of Jesus whose table this always is to serve and be served. Amen
