Keep your microphone on mute during worship unless told otherwise. Words in bold are meant to be said aloud at home with the Pastor or Liturgist who will say them on the Zoom call. Sing along at home to the sung responses and hymns. Close all non-essential programs on your computer and silence all notifications so you don't become distracted. Use the chat box for the passing of the peace and prayer requests or other worship responses. Chat directly to individuals as appropriate. If you are having technical issues please chat message Patrick Jackson for help. The Zoom room opens at 9:30am and worship begins at 10.

People: We come today, knowing you will listen and answer our needs.

Liturgist: We come today, to deliver our joined prayers of hope.

People: We come today, a people mourning still our losses, still recovering from the ravages of the Covid-19 pandemic and the pandemic of institutionalized racism that has plagued our world for too many centuries.

Liturgist: We come today, knowing you care for us

People: We come today, knowing that even when others reject us, your arms are open to offer comfort. We come.

Opening Prayer

Liturgist: God, your child Jesus taught us to welcome each other, but welcome often seems too little in this world. Welcome, without affirmation, becomes an empty promise, devoid of the lesson that to truly welcome each other means to see the face of God in each other. We commit to affirm all lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender people, Welcoming them and Affirming them as God's beloved creations. You taught us that whoever welcomes a prophet in the name of a prophet will see a prophet's reward; That whoever welcomes a righteous person in the name of a righteous person will receive the reward of the righteous. We know that until we are all free, none of us can be free, and we commit

to co-creating that world of welcome and affirmation until all people can access that promise. Amen.

Confession

Liturgist: We are a pilgrim people, accompanied by our God, who journeys beside us, accepting who we are; yet God also goes before us, beckoning us toward who we might become. But as we move through our days, other gods call to us, questions confound us, direction blurs, indifference lulls; we lose our way. So now we enter into silence and prayer, to discern again the nearness of God, who is our hope and guide. (A chime calls us to a time of silence.)

People: Creating God, you knit our bodies together. Bodies created in love and meant to be loved. Beloved masterpieces of a proud Creator. And yet, we have upheld these lies:

That some bodies are deficient.

That some bodies are illegal.

That some bodies are superior to others.

That some bodies, and some people, are fundamentally flawed.

That only some bodies are natural and normal and good.

We have borne these lies from our thoughts, passed them on to our

children, sputtered them from our mouths, and spat them at our neighbors. We have turned them in upon ourselves and out against one another. Like poison, they consume us, so that the truth that we are your beloved children is lost. Forgive us, O God, for believing these lies, for internalizing them, and for upholding systems which reinforce them. Forgive us for forgetting this truth: that our bodies were created in love and that we are your beloved children. Amen.

Words of Assurance

Liturgist: God pours mercy and grace down upon us until we are transformed into a new creation, until we see ourselves the way God sees us, and until we can love as God loves. By God's mercy, our feet are set again upon the path of faithfulness and our hearts are set again upon the coming of God's realm.

PRIDE Parking Lot Pop-up Event

Come out and show your PRIDE on Sunday, June 28 starting at 4:30pm in the parking lot of the church. Regrounding

The Property Operations Team invite you to spend some time "regrounding" yourself with a visit to the church property. Come and walk the labyrinth, sit in the prayer garden, pull weeds, separate bulbs/plants in the front beds or pick up trash along the property's edge.

While there, please take time to add a "prayer" strand to the loom hanging in the prayer garden. You are welcome to bring your own ribbon, shoelace, string or a piece of that old shirt you turned into a mask. Or use a piece from the bag clipped to the loom. Your prayer can be silent or shouted, sung or written. Laments and joys, fears and thanksgivings are all welcome. Life is woven with all of these; woven together, stronger together.

In Person Pastoral Visits

Now that the weather is improving it is possible to do pastoral visits outside in a safe way. Pastor Holly is available to meet with you in the prayer garden (or in your yard if you can't get to the church). Visits will observe proper social distance and include masks, but are a way to connect in person. You don't even have to have a topic to discuss!
