WELCOME AND WORDS OF INTRODUCTION

Pastor: In this season leading up to this night, we have been hearing the Good News from all the Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John because we have *needed* good news and that's what "Gospel" actually means. PRAYER OF CONFESSION

Leader:

When Jesus was born, he came to a world filled with poverty, and violence, and fear. He lived among people who did not always walk their walk perfectly, which is to say, Jesus was no stranger to sin. Our mistakes and failures come as no surprise to him. His love and mercy should come as no surprise to us. Therefore, let us make our confession before God and one another, first in silent prayer.

(A chime calls us to a moment of silence.)

People: God of stars and angels, God of sheep and lambs,

God of abundance and grace:

You know us well, better than we know ourselves.

You hear us cry "Gloria!" and "Praise!"

And you watch us tear things apart with our words and deeds.

You hear us say "Thy will be done" and "use me, O God"

And you watch us do the minimum in response to cries for help.

You know us, and you love us, and you forgive us. Hear us now say, "Help us to change; turn us around. Make us more loving and courageous and hopeful. "

Pastor: Our God, Song of the Ages, be with you.

People: And also with you. Pastor: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them up to the Lord.

Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Pastor: It is right, and a good and joyful thing,

always and everywhere to raise our voices with you, tuning ourselves to you, creator of heaven and earth.

You filled the night of creation with music and light, setting in motion the rhythms of sunrise and sunset, of sound and silence. You formed within us your love song and breathed into us the breath of life.

Sometimes our voices are choked off and we cannot find your melody.
But you keep the bass line humming, waiting for us to rejoin the chorus.
You show up in the worst of times offering us the way to freedom in you.
Your voice breaks through in prophets whose songs wake us up to the kin-dom you desire.

Holy are you, and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ.

That those who are alone and anxious feel you near.

That those who are ill in body and in spirit be comforted. That our friends and family be blessed by healing and love.

and in your mercy, answer.

Pastor:

And together let us pray the prayer Jesus taught us:

(Feel free to use whatever words or language for this prayer are most meaningful to you. The words below are a suggestion of one version of The Lord's Prayer.)

Our God who dwells in Heaven, hallowed be your name.

Your kingdom come, your will be done, on Earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil, for yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.

On the night on which Jesus was betrayed, he sat at supper with his disciples. While they were eating, he took a piece of bread. I invite you now to raise your bread at home up with both hands. Jesus said a blessing broke it, and gave it to them with the words, 'This is my body. Given for you. Do this to remember me.' I invite you to break your bread and return it to your plate.

Later, he took a cup of wine, and gave thanks for it.

Raise your cup up now before you.

Jesus said, 'This cup is God's forgiveness poured out for you and for all people. Drink from it, all of you, to remember me'.

I invite you to put your cup down as we bless these elements.

Come to us, life-giving Spirit of God. Bless us, these gifts, and what we do here, so that we might sing your song of love for your people and for your world. Amen!

SHARING OF THE BREAD AND CUP

(At this time you are invited to serve yourself or those with you the bread saying something like, "The Body of Christ given for you" or "The Bread of Life given for you". You can dip the bread in the cup saying something like, "The Cup of Salvation shared with you" or "The Cup of Blessing shared with you." We will pause here for a few moments so everyone has a chance to receive the elements.)

PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

People: God, we give you thanks that you have come to us – in the child of Bethlehem, in this bread and cup, and in your answer to all of our hopes and your offer of peace, deeper than any truce, truer than the upheaval that surrounds us. You have comforted us with your promise and your presence so that we too may spread the welcome wings of your good tidings. Amen.

Sending and Leaving

PASSING THE LIGHT

Turn down or off the lights in the room you are in. If possible, even if you normally have your camera off turn it on just for this song. Light a candle, either one of the ones you already lit tonight or a different candle. We will have a moment to light the candles and then look at our congregation together with our lights.

Leader:

The choice is ours to make, how we live into the possibilities of Christmas. The beauty is that we do not live out the choice by our own strength. We go with God, who lights our way forward. We go with Jesus who is born again in our lives right now. And we go with the Holy Spirit whispering in our ears and shouting into our lives, "The Savior is born, the Savior is born! Joy to the world!"

You may now extinguish your candle remembering that you now carry the light of Christ out into the world.
