Advent at UCCSV - I Believe Even When..

This year our Advent theme is "I Believe Even When..." 2020 has been a year of challenge and grief and sometimes even rediscovery. Can we proclaim that during this season, as the days grow shorter and the news sometimes frightens us, as illness spreads and financial struggles multiply, that we still believe in and affirm the goodness of God, the hope for a better day, and the good news of the Gospel that we are loved, always? The history of humanity is fraught with

pain-especially the pain that comes accompanied by fear and leads to oppression and violence of one people against another. This is the world into which Jesus was born and through which his teachings would challenge and call for transformation. The opening words of an anonymous Jewish poet, "I believe in the sun, even when the sun is not shining," were scrawled on a wall during the Holocaust. This theme song for our season calls us to examine our penchant for annihilating fear by annihilating each other. The power of narrative and music will call us to a different responsetransformation and reconciliation through hope, love, joy, and peace. This Advent and Christmas, let us fill the night with music and light and affirm and act on the reasons why we can still "believe, even when" we are discouraged.

This Sunday at UCCSV

As we come to the second Sunday in Advent our focus word is love. But we're not talking here about the kind of love that's easy or neat or even warms your heart. Instead, the love we're focused on is the kind of love that often requires sacrifices and that is sometimes hard to find. In our scriptures for this week both the Gospel of Matthew and Isaiah, a messenger appears as a sign from God, heralding a new era. A new way of being, of relating and loving takes courageeschewing the present order of things so that a new and better day can be born. The scriptures also challenge us on what it means to be in right relationship, what it means to be a family, and encourages us to look for "signs." What signs of love do you see in the world today? What signs are you showing to others? Let's worship together with music and prayer and wonder and

see what God has to offer us in this special season.

As you sit down to worship bring your Advent Wreath if you have one. If you don't have an Advent Wreath then bring two candles which will stand in as the first and second candle of the season (next week we'll add candle #3). As always the Zoom room opens at 9:30am and worship begins at 10am and will also be livestreamed to our facebook page and recorded for later posting to our website.

Stewardship Update

There's good news and there's hard news. The good news: A week and a half out from the end of our Stewardship Campaign and we have now received \$166,300 in financial pledges for our church's 2021 budget including 3 new pledges and 19 pledges that increased their giving for the coming year. Thank you so much for all who braved the various ways we had to pledge this year to make this happen. (For comparison purposes last year we had a total of \$167,600 pledged.) The hard news: As wonderful as that pledged total is given the financial strain of so many this past year, our budget situation as a church going into 2021 is going to be difficult. Due to financial struggles and a lack of building use in general we'll likely miss out on approximately \$15,000-\$20,000 of rental income. Last year's budget did not include staff raises and was already a \$3,000 deficit budget. We will not end this year with a deficit only because of money from the CARES act which allowed us to continue paying our staff at their current rates. It's likely that when the Council meets later this month to work out a final budget for 2021 they will need to make some hard choices. Please pray for our church leadership as they continue to steer us through these difficult times and help us all listen to God's still speaking voice as we seek to be the church together.
