The Soul of Aging Fall 2019 **Sessions**

The Soul of Aging will be offered again this fall. These sessions are for those fifty-five and older who want to explore, understand, and face the truths of growing older. Themes include beliefs about aging, forgiveness, our understanding of God, and reflecting on our own death. The Soul of Aging sessions use readings, poetry, thought-provoking questions, and working with images to assist each participant in embracing his or her own aging.

The first five 2 ½ hour sessions will take place on Saturday mornings at the Schmidt Davis

Home in Germantown from September 28-October 26. The last five sessions will be offered in a retreat format from Friday, November 1-Sunday, November 3. During the retreat weekend, Friday and Saturday sessions will take place at the Sumser's home and Sunday will take place at the Schmidt Davis home. Costs include a materials fee of \$15 and a \$125 registration fee. The class which will be co-facilitated by Suzanne Schmidt and Lois Sumser is limited to 8 participants.
