Sometimes unraveling shows us things we rather not notice but need to pay attention to. Injustice may be laid bare. Grief may be amplified. How do we grieve in the wake of unthinkable injustice and loss? This Sunday we'll explore the story of Rizpah, one of the secondary wives of King Saul, and how she reacts to the unjust murders of her sons, Rizpah shows us an honest, unapologetic grief and persistent strength in honoring the innocent lives of those taken from her. In the midst of a pandemic which has hit lower income people and people of color especially hard, and has laid bare undeniable cracks in our social fabric, what can we learn from Rizpah and how do we react to the injustice all around us? Join us for worship on Zoom at 10am (the room opens at 9:30am) and let's wrestle with these questions together.

For worship this Sunday we invite you to have a candle with you to welcome Christ's light into your home worship space and connect us all regardless of distance. We also invite you to create a protest sign that you would see at a march. If you were to protest the injustices of this moment, if you were to cry out with a loud voice until the powers that be listened, what would you say? We'll show our signs during worship as we learn to lift our voices together for God's peace and justice.

We have created a "Sign In" google document that will help collect information from new visitors and people who want to get on our mailing list (or members who want to update or change their address info on file). However, this is not the equivalent of our "red pads" during worship. If you are a regular member or have worshiped with us before and have left us your information, you do not need to fill out this form every Sunday. At in-person worship we use the red pads as a general means of gauging attendance and ask everyone to let us know you are with us by filling out your name. However, with Zoom worship we have a Deacon who is gathering that information so we do not need you to do anything additional. This form is only for people leaving their one time info or who need to contact us for something. If there is someone you know who would like to be on our Zoom mailing list or get our Spirit News, or if they need something like a pastoral visit or want more info on the church, or would like to leave us a note, this is the form for them.

May Worship Series -Unraveled: Seeking God When Our Plans Fall Apart

Through Sundays in May we will go on a journey asking ourselves what happens when our plans fall apart and unravel as they have in the past few months in the midst of a pandemic. Dear UCC Community,

On Sunday there was a widespread Zoom outage which meant that our usually way of worshiping, via the link I send out each week, was not working. People could get on but not see or hear others, there were lots of technical issues, and basically it was a mess. After about 40 minutes of diagnosing the issue and looking for alternatives, we ended up getting on via Patrick's (my husband) Zoom account through his University. Apparently their servers were stable in a way that our church account's was not.

Many people hung in there through various attempts to log on and several emails trying to give you updates. Others for various reasons were not able to, which I totally understand. Several churches I know who use Zoom as a worship platform were not able to worship at all on Sunday. Once we were able to get on we did record the service (which then went very smoothly). Because the video was recorded on Patrick's account we could not just leave it there

and send out the link as we usually do. Instead I have uploaded it to our church's public facebook page. You can find it here:
