Open Leadership Positions:

Chair of Property Operations Committee -Lead the team that helps to keep our building and property in working order and looking good. Be a contact for and help to oversee building renters. Serve on the Trustees and Church Council (meets once a month).

Chair of Christian Education - Lead the team committed to the spiritual growth and education of our congregation. Help to oversee Sunday School, Youth Activities, Family Events, Adult Education and more. Serve on the Church Council (meets once a month).

Other Essential Volunteer Positions We Need Filled:

Deacon - Focus on worship, pastoral care, and welcoming visitors. Deacons help make sure worship goes smoothly and helps to imagine all that worship could be. They also help to care for members of the congregation as needed with check-ins, phone calls, cards, or helping to coordinate meals.

Christian Education Committee Member- Be on the team committed to the spiritual growth and education of our congregation. Help to oversee Sunday School, Youth Activities, Family Events, Adult Education and more.

Fellowship Committee Member - Provide and coordinate for hospitality for the congregation. Mostly this involves fellowship time after worship on Sunday in the Gathering Room either providing food or assisting congregation

members who have signed up to provide food. But, this committee also helps coordinate any all church events that might require food or refreshments.

Property Operations Committee Member - Be a part of the team that helps keep our building and property in working order and looking good.

Social Action Committee Member - Be a part of the team that looks to do ministry outside our church walls (Germantown Help, Interfaith Works, UMAN) and seeks to advocate for justice in our wider community.

Stewardship Committee Member - Have fundraising ideas or want to make sure our congregation has healthy giving habits? Be a part of the team that designs, coordinates, and carries out our yearly stewardship campaign for donations of time, talent, and treasure.

Tellers - Know how to count money? We need you! Tellers work in pairs after church on Sunday mornings in order to count and document the morning's offerings.

All of these positions have varying commitments in terms of time and energy. But just imagine the kind of church we could be if all of us decided to volunteer at least 1-2 hours a week, or 4-8 hours a month at church or doing ministry work of one kind of another. That's only 1% of your time each week or month, but it would result in amazing returns. Consider where God may be calling you and commit to helping UCCSV make a difference!



Pastor Holly Named a Resilience in Leadership Program Fellow!

I excited to share with you that I have recently been named Resilience in Leadership Program Fellow with the Chicago Theological Seminary. This is a program for early career clergy. ministers, lay leaders, and seminary students who are from and/or serving economically disadvantaged and marginalized communities in the USA. The Resilience in Leadership Initiative at Chicago Theological Seminary is a 2 year long Fellowship Program designed to facilitate a full ecology of support for faith leaders. Program Fellows are matched into regionally-based peer groups lead by contextually grounded and seasoned mentors. In addition to facilitating professional relationships through these cohort communities, all Resilience in Leadership Program Fellows will also be resourced with customized skill-building workshops and opportunities for respite and self-care. Program Fellows and mentors from across the country will also take part in the program's annual three day gathering in Chicago in October 2019 and again at another meeting in Chicago in 2020. All fees and costs associated with the program are covered by a grant. This is an amazing opportunity for me to continue with my training and to build needed skills and bring that knowledge and any new ideas I encounter back to UCCSV. I look forward to sharing with you as I continue on this journey!
