Pastor Holly is creating a series of short podcasts where she reads biblical stories and other stories of love and justice for you to listen to on your own time and at your own pace. New stories will come out each week.

These stories are primarily created with children and youth in mind as a way to try to make more Christian Education opportunities available for our families that didn't involve a screen. However, the stories of "Holy Troublemakers" might be particularly interesting to people of all ages who maybe just need 10 minutes of listening to a great story. I also have reflection questions at the end of each story to consider and discuss.

This week's stories include a younger children's version of Psalm 150, the creation story from The Family Story Bible, and a story for older children and youth (and adults) about Alice Paul who was a Quaker suffragette.

#### **Our Youth in Action!**

On the Sunday before Election Day, some of the youth members of the Social Action Board, Clarisse and Miranda Lin, participated in a virtual phone bank marathon in order to encourage people of color to vote in several battleground states. They made calls to Florida, Texas, North

Carolina, South Carolina, and Georgia. Miranda and Clarisse report: "It was a very invaluable experience because we were able to help people to have the determination to vote and make their voices heard in this crucial election."

After a brief training, Miranda and Clarisse were able to easily call people or leave voicemails with information about the different methods for voting in their listeners' home states. As youth who cannot vote yet, they were thrilled to do this because by taking a small chunk of time to call people, they knew they were still making a difference and helping people to know that their voices count. They look forward to doing this again for another significant election, the upcoming runoff Senate elections in Georgia.

#### **Heartbeat Opera**

This December Heartbeat Opera, an independent opera company, releases a visual album called <u>Breathing Free</u>, loosely based on Beethoven's opera *Fidelio*.

The production features an all black professional cast, as well as singers and volunteers from six prison choirs. It will be streamed on six nights in December followed by live panel discussions on mass incarceration, prison choirs, justice and equity.


