
### **Holiday Boutique Cancelled**

# Transgender Day of Remembrance - November 20, 2019

Transgender Day of Remembrance (TDOR) is an annual observance on November 20 that honors the memory of the transgender people whose lives were lost in acts of antitransgender violence. Additionally, the week before TDOR, people and organizations around the country participate in <a href="Transgender Awareness Week">Transgender Awareness Week</a> to help raise visibility for transgender people and address issues the community faces.

This year UCCSV is supporting the TDOR event sponsored by MoCo Pride on Friday, November 15 at VisArts in Rockville (see the flyer below). Also, during the Sunday, November 24th worship service, the names of the transgender individuals who lost their lives due to anti-transgender violence in the US in the past year will be read aloud as we mourn the loss of each of these beloved children of God.



### **Stewardship Update**

This past Sunday was Consecration Sunday and we want to share with you some preliminary totals so far:

At this moment we have received 43 financial pledges for the 2020 budget year that add up to a total of \$144,472 to fund church expenses and ministries for the year to come.

That number includes 4 brand new pledges. 32 pledges either stayed the same as last year or increased their giving.

Pledges ranged from approximately \$500-\$8,000 breaking down into the following categories:

11 pledges under \$2,000 23 pledges from \$2,001-\$5,000 9 pledges from \$5,001-\$8,500

Last year we had 55 total pledge units that promised to provide a combined \$158,100 to fund the church's ministries in 2019. This means that we are hoping for some additional pledges to come in over the next few weeks so that our totals for 2020 at least match giving from 2019, if not exceed it.

It's important to keep in mind that last year our budget projected a small deficit and right now we anticipate ending the year a few thousand dollars in the red. The good news is that even though we needed major repairs to our air conditioning system this past summer, we have largely managed to keep the deficit under control. However, it's possible that when the Church Council prepares the budget for 2020 they will need to look at some cost cutting measures like freezing staff salaries and cutting some budget lines in order to try to minimize the deficit for next year based on the totals we have right now for giving in the year to come.

If you have yet to pledge for 2020 but anticipate doing so, please feel free to call the office and report your pledge to our Office Manager, Nita Stone, or mail your pledge to the church office at any time. If you need to amend your pledge in any way, please let Nita know. Nita keeps a record of pledge totals and will give you a report of your progress towards your pledge goal throughout the year.
