Being a Civil Voice in Uncivil Times

As it is, there are many members, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you,' nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you.' If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it." [I Corinthians 12: 21-26]

Tips for Faithful and Respectful Discussion

Show Respect: Rather than trying to "win" a debate with your arguments, judge your success by how well you demonstrate respect for other people.

Listen: Focus on what the other person is saying, rather than focusing on what you are going to say next.

Seek Understanding: Ask open-ended questions to understand the context from which other people are speaking, ask yourself why they see things the way they do.

Share Your Own Views Well: Put thought and energy into articulating your own views clearly and concisely. What do you believe and why? Statistics can be helpful, but often sharing your personal stories is most effective.

Keep Your Head: Remember to pause, take a deep breath, and give yourself time to respond. Few people benefit from a shouting match. You can help set the tone of the conversation by continuing to act with civility even when others are not.
