Worship Series: Prophecies and Pottery, Journey with Jeremiah

Do you look around at the world and despair? Heartache, displacement, violence, helplessness, and homesickness have long been a part of the ongoing human story. But it's not the end of the story. Our faith and our sacred scriptures invite us to deal openly and honestly with these things, helping us to remember the presence of God and the hope of a better future. During the month of September the assigned scripture passages from the lectionary give us the gift of journeying with the prophet Jeremiah during a time of exile for the Hebrew people. His interactions with God can give us insight as to how to be people of faith in difficult times and whether God is at work even when it seems all is lost. In this worship series we will encounter the familiar imagery of God as the Potter who can reshape and remake us, molding us as individuals and as the church, into vessels of living water ready for a brighter tomorrow.

Sanctuary DMV Accompaniment Training

Over the past two years, volunteers with Sanctuary DMV's accompaniment program have supported dozens of immigrants at their ICE check-ins, immigration court appointments, and more. Accompaniers provide moral and emotional support to immigrants going through extremely trying processes. They show solidarity, reduce the likelihood of detention with their presence, and keep relatives or lawyers informed in case of an arrest.

There is an increasing number of requests for accompaniment and more volunteers are needed to help fill the need. Because of the volume of requests for check-ins and appointments in Baltimore in particular, Sanctuary DMV is looking to build a bigger volunteer base in Maryland.

The next accompaniment training will take place on Saturday, September 14 at 1:30pm at Christ Congregational Church in Silver Spring, MD. Language skills other than English, and access to a car, are useful but by no means necessary.
