By grace grace grace you have been saved saved saved...Parents, remember that song? Ask your child to sing it. Martin Luther knew about grace and told everyone about it. We begin thoughts for Reformation Day:

Jesus' answer to the rich young ruler seemed at first to affirm his belief: "You know the commandments: You shall not commit adultery, you shall not murder, you shall not steal, you shall not give false testimony, honor your father and mother." (Luke 18:20 NIV) Thinking he had it made, the young man said, "All these I have kept since I was a boy." (Luke 18:21 NIV) He floundered in the depths of confusion and sadness when Jesus revealed his sin of idolatry, worship of his wealth. The only way we can be saved, Jesus explained in succeeding verses, is by God doing what is impossible for us to do-keeping the Law perfectly to earn for us the righteousness we could never earn, suffering and dying to pay the penalty for our sins, and rising from the dead to defeat death and Satan for us. As Ephesians 2:9-10 (NIV) affirms: It is by grace you have been saved, through faith-and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God-not by works, so that no one can boast.

Since salvation is God's most precious gift to us, the product of His work alone, and is in no way a result of anything we have earned, that is the message we and all believers in Christ are called to share with the world. Many who believe they can earn their own salvation by doing a whole host of things may not readily understand and accept this joyous Good News. Because that is true, St. Paul's request and reassurance in 2 Thessalonians 3:1-5 (NIV) is just as timely today as it was when he wrote it:

As for other matters, brothers and sisters, pray for us that the message of the Lord may spread rapidly and be honored, just as it was with you. And pray that we may be delivered from wicked and evil people, for not everyone has faith. But the Lord is faithful, and he will strengthen you and protect you from the evil one. We have confidence in the Lord that you are doing and will continue to do the things we command. May the Lord direct your hearts into God's love and Christ's perseverance awesome!
