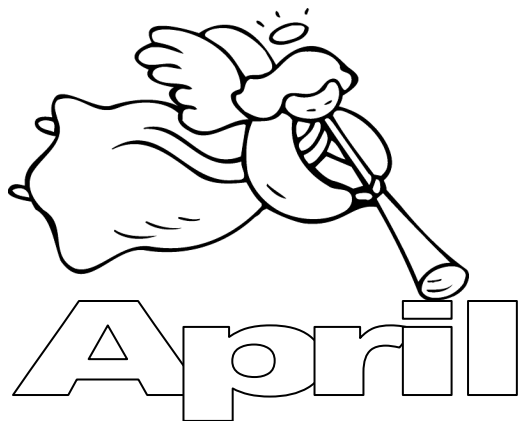

Reaching All Generations for Christ

Welcome to St. Luke's!

Through our ministry God saves the lost and heals the broken. Reaching all generations with the gospel of Jesus Christ, St. Luke's seeks to be good stewards of our ministry space. Because of this belief, we have made many changes to our campus over the past 1 1/2 years.

- The Little Lambs Nursery was relocated upstairs and remodeled into a child friendly space. We have a supervised nursery for 2 services every Sunday. Kristen Begeman shares a Bible story and lesson with the children each week. This project was funded by special donations and completed by several families who are invested in our youth.
- The Church Office is now located in the former nursery space on the lower level. A door bell system rings in the office and allows the church door to be opened remotely while maintaining security. The project was funded by the Investment Fund.
- The ADA-compliant glass doors make it easier for those with walkers and wheelchairs to enter the church. The doors allow more light to flow through the church entrance. The concrete pad in front of the door was replaced to make a smooth transition. The doors were funded by the Memorial Fund.
- Three moves occurred simultaneously to make room for the new Koinonia Café in the North Narthex: the library was moved to Fellowship Hall creating a beautiful sitting and reading area, the Mary Esther Room became Pastor's new study, and the wall between Pastor's old office and the narthex was removed to make way for the Koinonia Café. This area is a wonderful place to sit and have a conversation with someone, a ministry meeting or just hang out. Resources and information can be found in the Café. We purchased directional signs to help guide guests through our building. This was all funded by the Investment Fund.
- The Wi-Fi system was upgraded in the church and Centennial Hall at the request of members who use this technology regularly. This was funded by the Horace Cooper Bequest.
- The Hattie Cooper Room had a major facelift thanks to the family of Hattie Cooper. Ronna Drennen and a team of workers tore out the old flooring and then Ronna got to work choosing paint, flooring and new furniture. The old furniture was offered to the congregation for a donation. The project was finished with a new video display and cart that can be moved from the Hattie Cooper Room to the church when needed.



Join in prayer that these changes will not only open our space, but our hearts to reach out with grace to others.

Council Communique`

As we continue through our Lenten season we focus on the cross in anticipation of the resurrection and outpouring of the Holy Spirit. We also need to look around us and realize the Spirit is already among us meeting needs through our ministries. This was the teaching that opened our March meeting. Members saw the Spirit at work leading people to serve our faith family through council, music, sewing ministry, prayer shawls. Hattie Cooper Room renovation, Fellowship meals, new Sunday School programs, FCS, baptism celebration, Scout Sunday, etc. We also discussed the need to tell others how the Lord is at work healing, answering prayers, and giving people a sense of belonging.

Pastor's report included a brief summary of our 2016 ministries, and we sincerely thank our church staff for all their planning, oversight, dedication and hard work during the past year on our behalf. He noted the new TV screens have been used in the sanctuary and other ways, with unanimously positive feedback. He said no one has yet expressed an interest in going with him to Germany in July. He said there are families eager to host, so if you would like to travel to Germany this summer, contact PK.

Under New Business, we regretfully accepted Kerri Hay's resignation from council and we thank her for her service. We approved Carl Bowman, and welcomed Carl Bowman, Ronna Drennen and Liz Gordon to our fellowship.

Pastor discussed the concept of a "Wittenburg Door" exhibit to commemorate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. It will be on display by Centennial Hall entrance in time for the Saxonburg Arts Festival. Bob Kaltenhauser and Dick Smith are already working on this project and would love to have help installing it when ready. Please let PK know if you can help with the installation. There will also be a Wittenburg tab on our web page to provide info and factoids on the Reformation.

The "Blessing Box" is a new ministry undertaken by New Life to provide emergency food/personal hygiene items to those in need. We approved placing the Blessing Box on the side patio of Abba House for a six-month trial period to see if it meets a real need without causing any problems. Jim Wright and New Life will keep it stocked.

We thanked Jenny Hartzell (Stewardship Ministry) for writing our latest envelope letter. Outreach and Evangelism reported the quilt show will continue as a loving tribute to Betty Learn with Chuck Learn and Betty's quilting group helping. Please be sure to reach out to help and encourage this wonderful endeavor.

Property Ministry members Jeff Hartzell, Bill Gordon, and Rich Beatty have been busy doing a lot of jobs around the church, and we are so grateful for all they do. Please thank them for filling potholes and doing other much needed maintenance for us.

Christian Growth had the most to report including the Youth Mission trip plans now underway with Kelly Weston and PK chaperoning the teens to Maryland's eastern shore. VBS is gearing up for its great "Campout" June 11-14. We heard they have a wonderful and creative staff this year, so save the dates! Day Camp will need youth leaders and junior counselors if it is to continue. We reach about 40 children each year with this program, so please consider giving some of your time and talent to help.

Fellowship Care noted great attendance at our Social hours and the warm fellowship they bring. The Stars group will go to the Greensburg Art Museum, have lunch, and shop at DeLallo's Italian Market. The FCS retreat at Laurelville Retreat Center is shaping up to be a great time. Be sure to sign up ASAP.

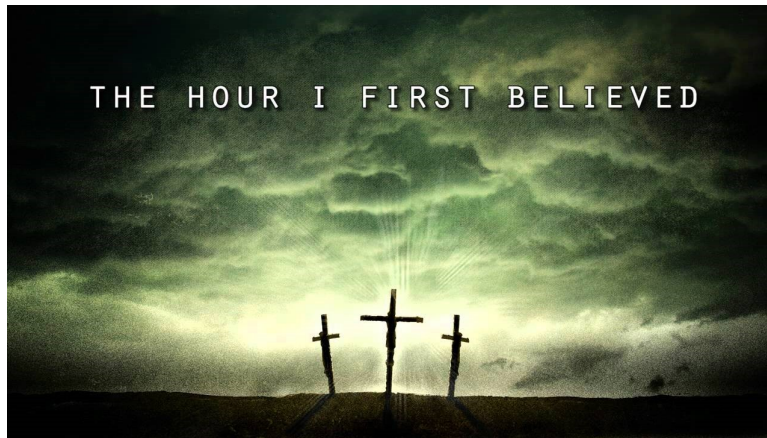

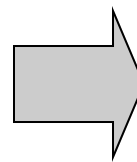

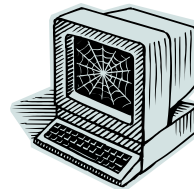

Benevolence

Welcome to the sixth year of a regular feature for the Angel highlighting the monthly recipients of St. Luke's Christian Mission benevolence funds. St. Luke's directly gives monies in 12 equal shares to mission and outreach ministries. The 2017 list was approved at the annual congregational meeting on January 29th.



The North American Lutheran Church Seminary Center is the April recipient of St. Luke's benevolence funds.

A proposal was approved at the 2013 NALC Convocation to establish a seminary that would provide for the theological education of future NALC pastors. The convocation also authorized raising \$1 million to fund the seminary. There are two components of the seminary: the Seminary Center at Trinity School for Ministry in Ambridge, PA, and Houses of Studies located within NALC Mission Districts.

There is one curriculum, one faculty and one focus, but many locations. The entire NALS system offers one core curriculum in Lutheran studies so that all students are receiving the same theological education.

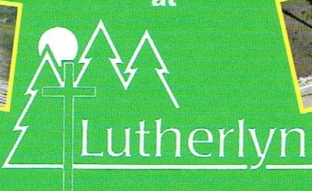

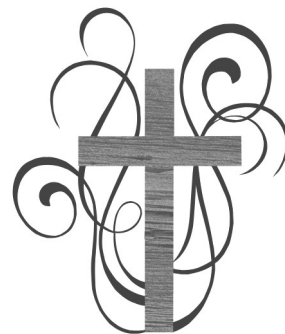
