Benevolence

Welcome to the fifth year of a regular feature in the Angel highlighting the monthly recipients of St. Luke's Christian Mission benevolence funds. St. Luke's has directly given \$19,800 in 12 equal shares to mission and outreach ministries (\$1,650 month).

Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA) is the September recipient of St. Luke's benevolence funds. FCA is an international, non-profit Christian sports ministry based in Kansas City, MO, but with a huge presence locally and throughout the Pittsburgh area.

In 1964, Don McClanen resigned as the Eastern Oklahoma basketball coach to start the ministry after he watched sports stars use fame to endorse and sell general merchandise. He wrote to 19 prominent sports figures asking for their help in establishing the organization that would use the same principle to share the Christian faith. Among its first supporters was Branch Rickey. Andrew McCutcheon of the Pittsburgh Pirates is one example of recent athletes featured in FCA publications or events.

The mission statement of FCA is to "see the world impacted by Jesus Christ through the influence of coaches and athletes."

FCA is marking its 63rd anniversary this year, challenging coaches and athletes on the professional, college, high school, junior high and youth levels to use the medium of athletics to impact the world for Jesus Christ. FCA anthony living focuses on serving local communities by equipping, empowering and encouraging people to make a difference for Christ. Some two million people are impacted through the agency's Four Cs of ministry – coaches, camp, campus and community. Its statement of faith

consists of seven points on biblical teachings and Christian principles.

Anthony Infante is the local representative for FCA, serving Butler, Armstrong and Indiana counties. He is now in his second full year. There are chapters, or huddles, at Knoch Middle and High Schools, Freeport HS, Armstrong MS/HS, West Shamokin HS, Slippery Rock HS, Mars HS and the Karns City football team. Butler HS is just starting out. The huddles are considered school activities and have teacher advisers. Anthony works with students, principals and school boards to get approval for chapters. Bible studies are student led and driven.

Among the highlights this year: 25 FCA leaders went to a leadership camp in Maryland, 12 students from Knoch, Freeport and West Shamokin schools accompanied Anthony on a June mission trip to the Dominican Republic. In October, FCA will hold its annual outdoor youth doe hunt in Dayton, PA. Anthony is expected to visit St. Luke's later this month. FCA is a member of the Christian Leadership Network.

Anthony lives in Saxonburg with his wife Shari and three children, Chloe, 6, Parker, 9 and Flliott 12


