

L: For any who are anxious about the worries of tomorrow:


C: God speaks, "Peace, be still."

FIRST READING: Isaiah 40: 1-11

L: The first reading is from Isaiah, the 40th chapter.

¹ Comfort, comfort my people, says your God.

² Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her

that her hard service has been completed, that her sin has been paid for, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins.

³ A voice of one calling:

"In the wilderness prepare the way for the LORD;

make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

⁴ Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low;

the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain.

⁵ And the glory of the LORD will be revealed, and all people will see it together.

For the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

- L: Please let us read together Psalm 85.
- ¹ You, LORD, showed favor to your land; you restored the fortunes of Jacob.
- ² You forgave the iniquity of your people and covered all their sins.
- ³ You set aside all your wrath and turned from your fierce anger.
- ⁴ Restore us again, God our Savior, and put away your displeasure toward us.
- Will you be angry with us forever? Will you prolong your anger through all generations?
- ⁶ Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you?
- ⁷ Show us your unfailing love, LORD, and grant us your salvation.
- ⁸ I will listen to what God the LORD says; he promises peace to his people, his faithful servants but let them not turn to folly.
- ⁹ Surely his salvation is near those who fear him, that his glory may dwell in our land.
- ¹⁰ Love and faithfulness meet together; righteousness and peace kiss each other.

SECOND READING: 2 Peter 3: 8-14

L: The second reading is from Second Peter, the 3^{rd} chapter.

⁸ But do not forget this one thing, dear friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day. ⁹ The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.

¹⁰ But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything done in it will be laid bare.

¹¹ Since everything will be destroyed in this way, what kind of people ought you to be? You ought to live holy and godly lives ¹² as you look forward to the day of God and speed its coming. That day will bring about the destruction of the heavens by fire, and the elements will melt in the heat. ¹³ But in keeping with his promise we are looking forward to a new heaven and a new earth, where righteousness dwells.

¹⁴ So then, dear friends, since you are looking forward to this, make every effort to be found spotless, blameless and at peace with him.

⁴ And so John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River. ⁶ John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ And this was his message: "After me comes the one more powerful than I, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸ I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."
