## FCS is ...

- a youth fellowship that begins with a heart commitment to becoming a faithful disciple of Jesus Christ
- built upon 4 areas of Christian stewardship
- endowed by the Christian Stewardship Education Fund to promote individual savings for members of FCS by offering a matching fund program for educational savings accounts tied to members' personal earnings and successful keeping of the covenant

## Who can join?

High school students who are part of the local Christian community and wish to grow into becoming faithful Christian stewards by learning how to avoid the pitfalls of today's economic pressures and ungodly definitions of success

## What to expect?

- Begin with signing a Fellowship Covenant which will require demonstrated pursuit of the completion of 4 foundation modules and pursuit of goals in the 6 marks of Christian discipleship
- Receive a mentor to guide the youth in keeping their goals of the covenant
- Fun and fellowship with other Christian teens
