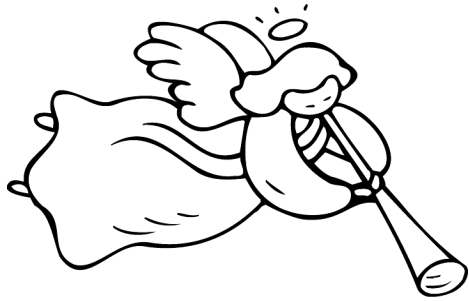

New Doors for the North Narthex

Check out the new ADA compliant doors at the parking lot entrance of the North Narthex. These new doors will offer a crash bar for safe exit in the event of an emergency and a new more gradual threshold which will make for an easier and safer entrance for all ages. This change creates a brighter entrance using a tinted high-quality glass door which complements the beautiful stone exterior. The new doors are a “welcoming” improvement. (This project is funded by the Memorial Fund, approx. \$5,000).

- Church Library to the Gathering Area in the Fellowship Hall (\$0)
- Pastor's office in the Mary Esther Room (\$0)
- Information Center and Gathering Area in North Narthex, previously Pastor's Study (Funded by Investment Fund and active donations, approx. \$8,000.)
- Technology in Wi-Fi and new security locks (Funded by Horace Cooper Fund, approx. \$3,000)

In 1925, Bob was born in New Stanton to the late Oliver and Olive Espey King. Bob attended grade school in Remer and graduated from high school in the Youngwood/Greensburg area. He was baptized at a Lutheran church in New Stanton in 1927, and confirmed there in 1937. Bob had one sister who is deceased.

He married D. Juanita (Nita) on May 24, 1946 at Youngwood. The couple will celebrate 70 years of marriage next year. Bob worked as an electrical inspector/underwriter, retiring in 1990. Nita had a career as an administrative assistant. Bob served with the US Marines during World War II, seeing active duty in Caladonia, Guadalcanal, Guam, Tinian and Saipan.

The Kings moved to the Saxonburg area in 2001 and joined St. Luke's church several years later. They have served as users, greeters, Meals on Wheels and on the Glade Run task force. They have two sons, two daughters, two grandsons, three granddaughters and one great-granddaughter.

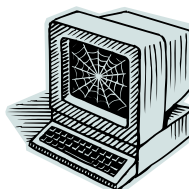
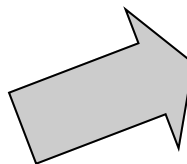

Benevolence

This continuing feature highlights the monthly recipients of St. Luke's 2015 Christian Mission benevolence funds. This is the fifth year that St. Luke's has directly given \$22,000 in 12 equal shared to mission and outreach ministries (\$1,833.33 per month). Now is the time to prayerfully consider ministries for 2016.

November Beneficiary

Katie's Kitchen is a church-based ministry that has served free community meals to Butler area residents for the past 21 years. Its mission is "We are honored to fulfill Christ's directive to 'feed the sheep' by providing wholesome, appealing meals at no cost to those in need within the community of Butler."

The community meal is sponsored by St. Mark's and Trinity Lutheran churches in Butler. Through the end of September, 4,257 meals were served to 3,865 adults and 392 children. The number of children have increased this year. The meal is served every Thursday from 5 to 6 pm. The ministry is named for Katie, the wife of Martin Luther, who became famous for her hospitality. Volunteers come from sponsoring churches, eight other churches and the community. Linda Thoma served as director until the end of October. Loretta Bachman assumed the position on November 1.

December Designee

The Sarver-Saxonburg Christian Leadership Network (CLN) is the December recipient of benevolence dollars. The Christian Leaders Network, of which St. Luke's is a member, consists of local Christian congregations and ministries working together for the sake of Jesus Christ to offer a helping hand to all in the community. CLN works together to help by: offering pastoral care, prayer and counseling to the community through every congregation/ministry; providing a small financial grant to offer a helping hand once a year to a family in need who lives in the Sarver-Saxonburg area; holding community worship services to inspire and strengthen people to grow in faith and Godly character.

The group comes together on a monthly basis for Bible study and business planning. The network regularly hosts and plans the rotating Lenten mid-week services, Holy Week activities and services, Thanksgiving Eve services, ministry seminars and youth gatherings. The Network also offers emergency crisis support, coordinates with the area food banks and assists people in need of care. A total of 20 families has been assisted through the end of September for heat, utility, rent, food and medical expenses.

It's that time of year when the League of Incredible Potatoes will appear on behalf of Cabot Food Bank. For the seventh straight year, Super Spud heroes of all types will be visiting St. Luke's worship services on November 1 and 8. The goal is to help make Thanksgiving dinner brighter for area families. The League wants to raise funds to purchase potatoes to feed 130 families served by the food Bank. Potatoes will be obtained through Har-Lo Farms and Karen Foertsch. Members of St. Luke's will pack bags on November 16 and distribution is scheduled for November 18. Our goal is to raise \$390 for the potatoes and additional contributions will be used for Christmas fruit baskets for the food bank's families, totaling \$690. A total of \$5,740 after expenses has been raised for the Educational Support Fund for the Steiner family.
