Automated External Defibrillators

Another need for the campus was two automated external defibrillators (AED). The AEDs have been received and will soon be installed in the North Narthex and Centennial Hall.

One of the AEDs was purchased by Rhoda Shoaf in memory of Jeffery Shoaf. Thank you Rhoda for your wonderful gift. We pray we never have to use it.

The total need remaining is \$1,540.00, which will be used to purchase smoke/carbon monoxide alarms, and first aid/blood clotting kits.

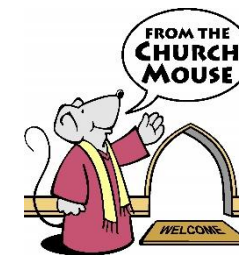

Mission Trips

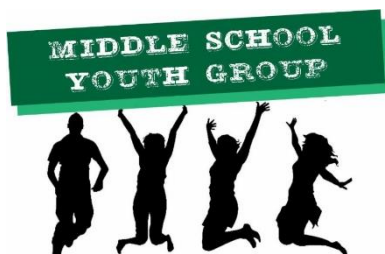
Calling all **students in 8th – 12th grade!**
