The contactors started on June 18th replacing the front porch in preparation of the electronic doors and the new entrance with safer accessibility.

During this time of construction:

Entrance to the church office and meeting rooms will be through the red door up the ramp from the back east parking lot. There will be no entrance through the red front doors, Hatlee, or Randles.
