Mother's Musings

I was recently driving along the River Road in Stillwater headed to the diocesan office. It had rained earlier that

morning and the fields were a lush green and the sun shining on the fields made it a beautiful sight. Right in the middle of the field was an equally lush patch of deep gold dandelions. The contrast of the deep gold surrounded by green was beautiful. The scene took me back to days when our children were very young. Young children cannot distinguish weeds that can trigger allergies from flowers.

As I drove on toward Greenwich, I began to think that this is a perfect analogy for sin. Sin is anything that separates us from God. Sin can appear beautiful from a distance but when you get closer you begin to suffer the maladies that it can trigger. Some never recognize that the sin in their lives is really ruining their lives.

Sin can take many forms. We are all capable of justifying our behavior to convince others, and perhaps ourselves, that our sinful behavior is justified.

We read in the Gospel of John that Jesus said, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:34-35). When we love someone, truly love them, we do not want to stand in the way of that person's relationship with God. When we participate and encourage sinful behavior that is not showing love.

Christians are the Body of Christ. The Body is healthy when all members strive to follow Jesus' example and commandments. This is best done in community. When we pray, worship, study scripture, and participate in Christian community we have the best chance to support each other along the Christian journey. Jesus said that he is the Good Shepherd. He said, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly" (John 10:7-10 NRSV).

Sin may look attractive from afar but nothing is more attractive than a life where Jesus is first. That doesn't mean that we are perfect, we are far from perfect! It is a matter of the direction we are going. Are you daily moving closer to God through his Son Jesus the Christ, or are you moving a little further away each day?
